Let us all welcome **Wanona Goetz**—the church's new Parish Nurse!

Wanona is now on-the-job—and is looking forward to meeting and serving you—and as she comes to know us all, truly becoming the *nurse of the parish*. As such she will be used by God in the healing ministry of this church.

Elsewhere in this newsletter is Wanona's own welcome and introduction of herself to you. You will discover her to be a registered nurse who is warm and friendly, approachable, knowledgeable, and with a depth and breadth of experience from various nursing settings.

She has moved into her office at the church, and will be working on average 20 hours per week. There will be opportunity to meet and know her on some Sundays, as well as making contact with her through the church office.

As her actual work days, and hours per day develop, her role will include such responsibilities as:

- collaborating with the pastor in congregational visitation (hospital and beyond),
- being available to consult with members regarding their health care issues,
- offering referral information on medical resources and community services,
- being available to visit congregation members in home for routine health maintenance procedures,
- serving as an educational resource on health topics,
- conveying the healing presence of Christ through words, deeds, and prayers,
- being available to assist with health care needs in the Child Care Center, as needs arise.

Even though the church has been served by the parish nurse position in its past—as Wanona re-establishes this special ministry the expectation is not that it will be done exactly as it was in its past. She will be working with us to develop a parish nurse ministry that best fits the needs and desires of the congregation of the present time, and going forward.

I encourage you to welcome Wanona to this church family with your warmth, and also with your prayers for her and for the special gifts and calling that she will bring as we all serve Christ faithfully as his church.

SEARCH COMMITTEE NEWS...

Session Calls for Special Congregational Meeting For September 10

At its August 22, 2017 meeting, the Session approved calling a Special Congregational Meeting after worship on September 10, 2017 for the purpose of electing a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) to continue the search for our next pastor.

When notified by Pastor Reiter of his intent to retire at the end of 2017, the Session initially decided to form a Search Committee, comprised of only Session members, to conduct the search for a Designated Pastor. (The same approach that resulted in the call of Pastor Reiter) A Designated Pastor is considered a temporary position that can be converted to a permanent position (Installed Pastor) if, after a period of time, both the congregation and the pastor wish to change the relationship from temporary to permanent. After 3+ months, the Search Committee has reviewed and evaluated twenty (20) prospective candidates and interviewed three (3). One (1) candidate that was interviewed and was invited to visit Bismarck and preach at a neutral pulpit site, declined the invitation. The Search Committee believes it has now exhausted the supply of available candidates in the denomination's system that have indicated their interest in a Designated Pastor position and that may be suited to serve the needs of our church.

It is believed that our church is now ready to call its next Installed Pastor. Before Pastor Reiter was called, that was not the case. Now, after achieving more stability and direction under the leadership of Pastor Reiter over the past 1 ½+ years, we are ready. Modifying our Ministry Information Form to describe the position we wish to fill as an Installed Solo Pastor will make many more prospective candidates available to be matched with the position described in our Ministry Information Form. We can expect may more referrals than have been received to date by the current Search Committee. It may also encourage others, not in the denomination's network of prospective candidates, to contact us directly regarding their interest in being considered for the position.

The Session has decided to call for a Special Congregational meeting on September 10 to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). Calling an Installed Pastor requires the formation of a PNC. The Session cannot elect itself to serve as the PNC, as it could when forming a Search Committee for the purpose of searching for a Designated Pastor. An Installed Pastor is defined as a permanent pastoral position while the Designated Pastor position is defined as a temporary pastoral position.

If you are interested in serving on the PNC to select our next pastor, or know another member you would like to see on the PNC, please complete the form on a bulletin insert that will be in the bulletin on September 3 (same as appeared in August 27 bulletin). If you were not in attendance on August 27 and will not be in attendance on September 3, and are interested in serving on the PNC, or wish to offer the name of another member you would like to see on the PNC, please complete the form on the next page and return it to the church as soon as possible.

The Holy Spirit is with us continuously in the search for our next pastor. We firmly believe that the search for an Installed Pastor to lead our church is the direction the Holy Spirit is leading us at this time.

Please continue to pray for the efforts of the Search Committee as it completes it work and the Pastor Nominating Committee that will continue the search for the next pastor of our church.

A PNC is required by the *Book of Order* whenever a search is to be conducted for a <u>Called and Installed Pastor</u> (compared to the current search for a <u>Designated Pastor</u> that may be later converted to a Called and Installed Pastor).

CLERK'S REPORT

Membership is 507. Session approved the request of Richard Hoberg to be removed from the membership roll.

COMMITTEE REPORTS (from meeting and committee minutes)

Property and Equipment—Members of the Parlor Refurbishing/Furniture Committee, Donna Richter, Ann Lynch and Nanc Skaret, presented the plan to purchase chairs, loveseats, a coffee table and one 3-cushion sofa for the Parlor. One leather sofa is being donated. Session approved the use of Merritt Reserve Fund up to \$10,000 to purchase new furniture from Conlin's. The four green chairs will be retained but not the two gold ones. Old furniture will go to the youth rooms downstairs or be sold on Bis-Man. Bids are still being received for sidewalk repair.

Administrative and Personnel—Session approved the renewal of Emily Ehrens as a Christian Education intern for 2017-2018 as well as the internships for Olivia Bachmeier and Mark Jensen. Funding will come from the Richter-Chapman Memorial.

Wanona Goetz has been hired as the Parish Nurse. She will work about 20 hours weekly, \$30 per hour and begin August 28th. She will be introduced at worship service on September 3rd. She has over 30 years of nursing experience.

Three-month maternity leave for Ashley Greenwood was approved by Session. She would use accumulated sick leave, vacation time and comp time and would be paid for half-time for three weeks.

Outreach—Session approved a welcoming banner written in 3 languages to be displayed outside the church. The sign is being used around the country. Property and Equipment will have input about how/where the banner will be displayed.

Stewardship—John Richter asked the Elders to volunteer to be visitors for the Stewardship Campaign.

Membership—Session approved the sponsorship of a table (7 people) at the Bridging Cultures: Building Connections Cultural Competency Seminar on October 14th at the ND Heritage Center. \$100 will come from the Membership Committee Budget. It is hoped that seven FPC members would be attending.

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SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

Worship and Music—Christmas Eve Sunday service will be at 10:00 am and a family worship service would be held at 5:00 pm. There would be no 11:00 pm service. Communion will be served at the 5:00 pm service. Ads need to be placed for an Organist/Pianist for this winter.

Christian Education—Back to Church Sunday is September 10th. The committee approved rental of a bouncy house. PAC parents will be asked to sign-up to help on Wednesday nights. Free-will donations received for the "sale" of the 1973 church plates will be divided between Fine Arts Festival Committee and the C.E. Committee. 32 children participated in Vacation Bible School and about 40 people came to Harmon Lake.

Child Care Center Board—Three new full-time employees have been hired so more children will be able to be served at the center.

Deacons—Deacons were asked to serve as visitors for the Stewardship Campaign.

SEARCH COMMITTEE

Session approved three motions concerning the formation of a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) of 12 members elected from the congregation; to transfer funds and information from the Search Committee to the PNC; to have Session serve as Nominating Committee for PNC with Elders Jim Skaret, David Massey and Bill Jensen to lead that committee. The PNC would search for an Installed Pastor. A special Congregational meeting will be held after worship on September 10th for the purpose of electing the PNC.

The Ministry Information Form has been modified to show the search for a solo pastor and will be approved by the Presbytery Committee on Ministry in September.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Reiter reminded Session that Charee needs to be notified of all meeting dates. The congregational meeting for the purpose of electing church officers and approving bylaw changes will be held on October 22nd instead of October 29th.

PROJECT SERVICE CONNECT

Missouri Valley Coalition for Homeless People completed their 9th Project Service Connect on August 17th at the Bismarck Veterans Memorial Public Library. One hundred thirty persons attended this event. Thirty five were children. Twenty eight helping agencies and organizations set up tables and provided information on resources available in our communities. Tables also held items such as a table for shampoo, body wash, soap and other personal care items and a table for diapers and baby clothing. Three tables held the items donated by helping churches which included winter hats, scarfs and mittens and adult and children's socks. Glance Spa and Salon had 4 stylists donating their time providing haircuts. It was fun to see some small children loving their new hairdo. Pizza was donated by Bruno's and Arrowhead Dan's Super Market donated bottles of water. A table was set up with bread items which our participants picked up as they were leaving. They also each got a blanket as they were exiting the Project Service Connect.






Our Outreach Committee is so grateful to the First Presbyterian Church Family for your loving actions helping to make this service event for homeless and needy families. The atmosphere at the event was filled with happiness and many of the volunteers from churches seemed to glow with love. Our church family provided at least 10 tie blankets (which we made in the spring) and the winter hats, scarfs and mittens and socks filling almost ten large plastic bags.

Many of the hats we knitted or crocheted by members and we especially appreciate the 40 hats crocheted by Vanessa Hein, the Assistant Director of the Childcare Center. Our knitting party group came through with homemade items. Special


