Biblical Prophecy vs Man's Prophecy

(continued from last week...)From just a fraction of the Old Testament we see a new religious dispensation in preparation. But if one doesn't feel as if the verses already mentioned are enough or specific, then what of Micah 5:2 which sends one's eyes looking toward Bethlehem (cf. Mt. 2:4-6). And then there is Micah 4:1,2 speaking of the spreading of the message that accompanied the Messiah.

It is even the case that the Israelites should have understood at least some of the basic things from the scriptures which many evidently did not come to understand (e.g. how that Christ would be rejected of his people as per Isa. 53). In putting these verses together an expectation or expectations of events was put in place, BUT only fully revealed and expounded in the New Testament. One could go on and on with this, but let's stop here and now consider inspiration.

Prophecy proves the Bible

Consider the world today. It is undeniable and empirically verifiable that the Bible does exist and that there are millions which claim to follow its dictates. How can the Bible and Christians be explained? It would be admitted even by unbelievers that Christianity can be traced back to at least the time of the Roman Empire. Upon completion of the scriptures there must have been a very quick growth in Christianity. If then the historical accuracy of the scriptures may be assumed (and there is good evidence that it is) then the coming of the Bible and Christianity can only be accounted for by the Bible being the inspired word of God. This is the case because of the fulfillment of prophecy. Man is simply not capable of predicting that kind of fulfillment of prophecy. How could the Old Testament writers have known to write prophecy at all, much less in the particular way that they did write? They could not have known of the coming of Christianity! Let me illustrate. Let us say Isaiah sat down to write part of his book. Now can you picture him, without any knowledge given to him by God, just thinking, "You know, I'd better put in some predictions about the coming of, oh, say, a... no make that the messiah. Now, I'll make all kinds of assumptions about what the future is going to be like, write some more, and then foist this off on the people for the fun of it. After all, the things I write just might last a long time and get put in a book when Christianity rolls around."

It is easy to see that without God directing things the above scenario is simply impossible. On the other hand, if all that one admits about history is that the Bible has correctly spoken of those things the archaeologists empirically confirm, then can prophecy still prove inspiration? Yes! To say that prophecy did not prove the Bible to be from God would be to admit the possibility of the following kind of scenario: A group of well traveled historians and linguistic experts convened almost 2000 years ago to deliberately deceive the people (cf. Jn. 20:30) into believing in a false system of religion for which they would not get credit for starting, and which speaks out repeatedly against the kind of deception that they were foisting on the people. This scholarly and obviously rational group of men (cf. Jn. 8 and I Cor. 15), then proceeds to produce arguments for accepting Christianity which are fundamentally flawed. Why? Because they base Christianity on fulfillment of prophecy which they themselves obviously "cooked up," because those prophecies and Biblical types were not known by the people until this group told them about the prophecies, and the religious characters, and so on and so forth. The point is that without Judaism already in place and thus an historical fact as recorded in the Bible, the arguments made in the New Testament are fundamentally flawed. Add all of this up and whatever other ridiculous conditions that must have been met and you see it is impossible to get Christianity without the Bible being true.

Since God exists miracles, and in particular prophecies, are possible. The Bible is a true, unified story of man, sin, salvation, and Jesus the Christ. In this story the writers wrote in such a way that their prophecies must have been inspired by God. This shows the soundness of the writers message, which is the Bible. -Tim McHenry
