### TECHNOLOGY MAKES IT EASIER TO GIVE

Since mid-August, yellow cards with a QR Code have been placed in the



pews to help you quickly navigate directly via your smartphone device to CPC's donation site.

For those unfamiliar with this technology, essentially you open your camera app on your phone, focus on the code, and then a pop-up message will display that you can tap with your finger. This will automatically launch your web browser app and take you directly to our donation site. Once there, you can select donate with your credit/debit card, or if you have a PayPal account, simply log in and then follow the directions to make your donation. Once you have navigated to the site, future visits will be a snap. You simply put in the amount you want to gift and hit pay. It is super fast and takes less than 30 seconds to make a contribution.

Give it a try. This is just another of many methods you can use to support the church.


