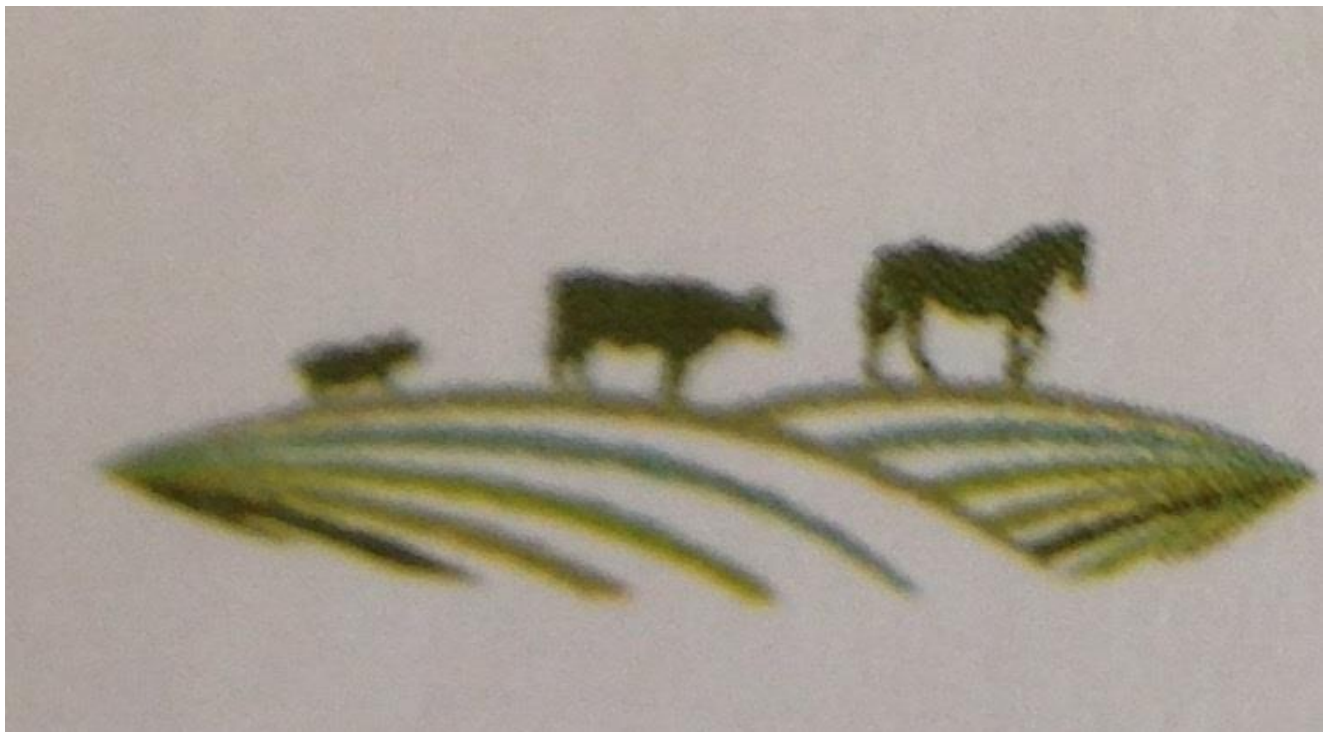

General Rules and Information

ENTRY DEADLINE IS MONDAY, JULY 16, 2018 AT 5:00 P.M.

No new or additional entries will be accepted after the deadline; no exceptions.

Any item brought in on the morning of the fair and not pre-registered will be excluded in judging.

- Gate admission entitles one to exhibit in Home Living section and good for one admission to the grounds. 5% of \$5 or over on prize money from Hall will be deducted.
- No animal or article will be admitted which has not a distinguishing number obtained from the Secretary.
- Produce and manufacturers must be delivered to the persons having charge of the show rooms and grounds, or be placed in their respective classes under their direction.
- Should there be only one exhibitor in any class, or section of a class, the judges are to use their own discretion as to the awarding of a premium, and they may refrain from making an award where they do not think the article worthy.
- No person will be allowed to interfere with the judges while in the discharge of their duties. Should an exhibitor so interfere he will forfeit all claim to any premium to which he might otherwise be entitled.
- Should any fraud, deception or dishonest practice be discovered on the part of any exhibitor or his agent, the Board of Directors may withhold any prize awarded, and may prohibit such exhibitor from exhibiting for such time as they may determine, and may publish the name of such exhibitor should they deem it proper to do so.
- **No prize article shall be taken or removed from the show until after 4:00 p.m. without approval of the President. If the prize article is removed contrary to the rule, the premium awarded for it will become forfeit.**
- The judges are requested to report to the Communiplex on the Fair Grounds to commence duties on the day of exhibition.
- While the directors will take every precaution possible under the circumstances to ensure the safety of articles sent to the exhibition, the owners must take upon themselves the whole risk, and should any article be injured, lost or stolen, while the directors will give every assistance in their power to the restoration thereof, they will not make any payment for the value thereof, or for the injury or loss. Exhibitors please insure your exhibits.
- Any protests against decisions of the judges must be made in writing and handed to the director in charge within one hour after decision, accompanied with the fee of \$1 which fee will be returned if appeal is sustained.
- Public admitted to the Hall on the day of the show as soon as judging is completed.
- No sideshows admitted to the Fair Grounds unless approved by the directors.
- If any damage, loss or injury to person property shall be proximately caused by reason of neglect of any willful act of any person, firm or corporation, their agents, representatives, servants or employees having license or privilege to exhibit on said exhibition grounds, or occupying space thereon, the Exhibition shall in no manner be responsible therefore, and in case it be subject to any expense or liability, all persons causing the same are liable therefore and shall indemnify the Exhibition.
- Receipts for donations will be available in the office for pick up.

Grain, seeds, roots, garden productions and fruit must have been grown on land occupied by the exhibitor and be his or her property. In all exhibits of roots and grains the name of variety of same must be given. All articles entered for exhibition shall comprise neither more or less than the numbers or quantities named in the prize list as to be shown and there must be no names, letters or marks on any tag.

No more than one article may be shown in any of the following classes by one exhibitor. Hall door closed 8:30 a.m. on Fair morning to all exhibitors. Judging starts at 9:00 a.m.

2017 Manitoba Ag Society Provincial Quilt Competition

Rules and Regulations (Subject to changes)

1. Competition is open to all quilt exhibitors.
2. The judging criteria are included in the "Judging Standards" Fair Book.
3. Quilts may be entered in three categories:
 - hand quilted
 - self-guided (domestic/mid arm)
 - track (mid/long arm)
 - The entry must be completely quilted by the person submitting the quilt.
 - No commercial quilting will be allowed (machine quilted by someone other than the exhibitor).
4. Quilts must have an appropriate title and give appropriate credit to pattern designer if not original
5. Quilts must be clean; any with stains and/or markings; pet hair will not be accepted.
6. Quilts must have a perimeter of at least 240 inches (590 cm) to be considered for the competition.
7. A fabric quilt label must be attached to the bottom right corner on the backside of the quilt entry.
 - Labels must be covered at all judging levels.
8. Quilts must be delivered/packaged in a durable and labeled clear plastic bag for handling.
9. Pre-stamped or direct product of quilt kits will not be accepted; however "Block-of-the Month" quilts, if not kitted, are eligible for the competition.
10. Quilters must sign a release form when the quilt is entered at the local event.
11. A Score Sheet will be distributed to all Societies, which must be used to judge the quilts. Any quilt not scoring 70 or more points will not qualify for the District or Provincial Competition.
12. Each Society may select up to six quilts (2 hand quilted, 2 mid/long arm quilted and 2 computer aided) at their Fair to participate in the District Competition. Up to a total of six quilts will be chosen at the District Competition to go on to the Provincial Competition.
13. Exhibitors may enter more than one quilt in this competition. However, they may only have one hand, one self guided and one computer aided quilt advance to the Provincial Competition.
14. Any quilt may be entered in competition at as many Fairs as the exhibitor wishes. However, it may only represent the Society where it was first entered in the Provincial Competition and won. The exhibitor must advise Societies at the time of entry if their quilt is a winner at a previous fair.
15. If an exhibitor does not wish to participate in the Provincial Competition, the runner-up quilt with a score higher than 70 will be selected to represent the society in the District Competition.
16. At the district level prize monies will be awarded for the top quilts in each category. At the provincial finals, there will be prize monies available in the Hand Quilted, Self-Guided and Track Categories.
17. All District Winners/Provincial Entries will be held for display at the Provincial Quilt Finals as well as the Red River Ex 2015 after which quilts will be returned to the quilters.
18. M.A.A.S. will take the utmost care of the quilts; however, quilt owners are responsible for insuring their own quilts, if they so choose. The sponsors, societies, and M.A.A.S. will not be liable for damage or loss.

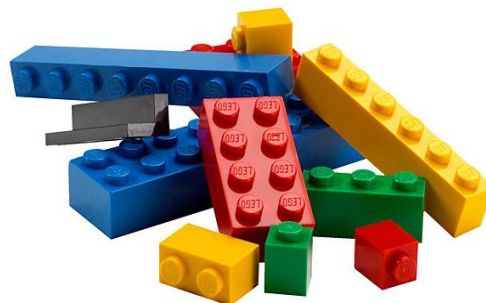
