Program Description

In the Accounting program, emphasis is placed on the application of fundamentals, principles, and theories with the accounting equation approach. The theory of debits and credits, classification of accounts, construction and preparation of financial statements, use of a trial balance, and technical procedures involved in closing operation accounts, and accounting for sales and inventory will be covered. Also featured will be applications focusing on cost volume-profit analysis, accounting for long-term liabilities and equity, applied academics, accounting information systems, time value of money, fixes assets, and business financial management.

The advanced level features advanced accounting concepts using VEI (Virtual Enterprises International) program and hands-on accounting applications including the use of Quicken Personal Finance software. A major focus will be placed on EXCEL spreadsheet usage and real-life accounting deposits and check requests. Students will be responsible for inventory and preparation of financial records for the school store, DECA and VEI. A business mathematics simulation will be a requirement.
