2019 Accomplishments



Coordinated Entry System (CES) Expansion

- Selected a 3-year **CE Operator**
- Launched **Domestic Violence CES**
- Added CES staff, including a **Housing Locator**
- Created **Landlord Support and Incentive Fund**
- **Developed CES marketing** (website, email, social media)
- **Assisted 1296 Active Clients**
- **Provided 621 Referrals** for Housing and Services
- **Successfully Exited 225 Clients** to Permanent Housing



Unsheltered Point-In-Time Count

- **7% Decrease** in People Experiencing Homelessness
- **59% Decrease** in Chronically Homeless Individuals
- **51% Decrease** in Homeless Families with Children
- **6% Decrease** in Homeless Veterans
- **18% Increase** in PIT Count Volunteers

- Invested **\$1,000,000** in **Diversions and Prevention**
- Allocated **\$708,514** to **Youth Services**
- Received **CESH II \$369,994**
- Awarded 2019 **ESG \$302,654**
