

#### **Our Purpose and Objectives**

- To increase access to social services and counseling services.
- To increase access to youth programming.
- To partner with existing stakeholders such as the school district and Shippensburg University to meet educational and community needs.

The SCRC was started in 2010 in response to the growing need to help residents find and utilize social services. Shippensburg falls between the counties of Franklin and Cumberland which means that services can be difficult for community members to access if the services extend to Shippensburg at all. The Resource Coalition has brought service providers and community members together since this time, with the aim of connecting clients with resources as well as developing programs to meet needs.

The SCRC is a Shippensburg University Center For Excellence and serves as a "learning lab" for the university. Students, Faculty, and staff are involved in our work and have initiated many of our programs and services. We also provide a bridge for building community-university relationships. #### The Word of God Alive:

#### Discussing the Readings w/your children

Here at our parish, we are transitioning away from Children's Liturgy of the Word during the Mass, and instead, we would like to encourage parents to discuss the weekly readings or homily with their children either before or after Mass occurs. This spiritual conversation, even if it is simple or a bit scattered, can be very powerful, and it is a way for God's word to come alive in our hearts. We will provide questions and discussion points to help parents start this conversation with their children, and please consider doing this with your family each week!

Last week we talked about being a disciple of Jesus. Once you said yes to Jesus, what do you do next?

Jesus spoke of the humble. He called them "the poor in spirit", "those who mourn", "the meek", and "those who hunger and thirst for righteousness". We know that the "poor" do not have enough. Those who "mourn" are those who are very sad because someone they love has died. Those who are "meek" don't have power. We have all been hungry and thirsty. But what does it mean to hunger and thirst for righteousness? It means to have a need for goodness that is so strong that one suffers for it. All of these types of people are missing something important, yet Jesus calls them blessed.

What does it mean to be blessed? Jesus not only named those who suffer, but said those who help suffering people are blessed also. He named people who show mercy, who are clean in heart, who are peacemakers and those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake. Showing mercy can mean to be compassionate or forgiving. To have a clean heart is to love the things and people we should. Being persecuted means that someone makes us suffer. We all know what making peace means.

Living our Faith: Take one of the ways we can be blessed and make it your mission to do as many things possible to show your love for God through others.


#### **Book of Month: January & February 2023**
