Milford High School INTRODUCTION TO THEATRE ARTS

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Location: Milford High School, Room 704 / Little Theatre

Course Overview

In this one-semester (.5 credit) **Introduction to Theatre Arts** course, students will develop critical thinking and reading skills while studying the history and structure of dramatic literature. Students will be introduced to several aspects of the theatre: basic acting and directing, improvisation, auditioning, scene building, character development, and basic theatrical design areas. Students will be expected to perform in improvisation segments, memorized short scenes and do a full, memorized monologue. They will be required to view and critique others. Students will also be required to read and analyze dramatic literature. Memorization and analysis are highly emphasized in this course and a 9th/10th grade reading-level is highly recommended.

Special Features of Introduction to Theatre Arts

- Qualifies for .5 of the Visual Performing Applied Arts graduation requirement
- Work based learning opportunities through the Michigan Educational Theater Association (META) and the Internationals Thespian Society (ITS) will be provided to students, as well as mentorship through the United States Institute of Technical Theater
- Students are invited to participate in the Milford High School Thespian Club a local after-school student organization of the International Thespian Society
- Students will be required to pass a laboratory safety test before they can participate in the shop/laboratory experience. This safety test is given to ensure that every student is aware of the safety rules and regulations in this classroom.
- Many CTE programs at Milford are covered by articulation arrangements with local colleges and
 universities. "Articulation" is the process allowing students to earn college credit for demonstrating
 skills and competencies in their Milford High School coursework. Currently, we are working with
 Davenport University for articulated credit for the Theater Arts program see me for details!
- We are working to offer USITT (Association for Performing Arts & Entertainment Professionals) industry certifications through the eSET/Essential Skills for Entertainment Technicians exams in one or more of the following areas:
 - o Basic Terms & Safety, Rigging, Lighting & Electrics, Costuming and/or Wardrobe Technician

- Do NOT touch ANY of the theatre's equipment or materials (props, costumes, set pieces, etc.) without teacher permission!!!!!!!!!

Tardies:

- The classroom door will close immediately after the bell. You are now Tardy!!!
- If you do NOT have a valid excused pass from a STAFF member:
 - Tardies 1-3 will result in a warning.
 - 4+ tardies will result in an after school detention.
 - Work/Quizzes/Tests that occurred (and handed in) while you were not in class will result in no credit & may not be made up. If a quiz/test is already in progress you will be able to take it but no extra time will be given.
- If you have a valid excused pass from an MHS Staff member (that can pass my investigation), any quiz/test missed must be made up directly after school on that day or no credit can be earned, and any assignment handed in will receive ½ credit. If a test has begun, you will be let in but you will not receive any extra time to complete it.
- Being more than 25 minutes late will result in an UNEXCUSED absence!!!

Late Work:

Simply put, late work is NOT accepted.

All performance dates will be announced in advance. Your grade is based almost completely on live performances so if you miss it, you cannot be graded. BE IN CLASS!

Absences:

You must get an absence excused within 24 hours or it will be considered UNEXCUSED.

• **EXCUSED ABSENCES** – if work was due, it is due upon your return. If you miss a performance date, accommodations (usually a monologue) will be made but the performance will go on without you.

Absences (continued):

• **UNEXCUSED ABSENCES** – a zero will be applied to all work completed or any performances done on that day. No make-up work or make-up performances will be allowed. Multiple offenses will result in administrative action (detention, suspension, etc.)

Excuses called in after 24 hours of the absence WILL NOT be considered valid in my class. Your parent/guardian MUST notify attendance by 9:30 am the next day or before.

Performance days will be scheduled in advanced. Since much of what we do is done in groups, it is extremely important you are present on your designated performance day. An unexcused absence will result in a 0 for the performance. Excused absences will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.
