Texas Legislative

HB 1927 <u>Texas</u>
<u>Legislature Online -</u>
<u>87(R) History for HB</u>
1927

Relating to provisions
governing the carrying of a
firearm by a person who is
21 years of age or older and
not otherwise prohibited by
state or federal law from
possessing the firearm and
to other provisions related to
the carrying, possessing,
transporting, or storing of a
firearm or other weapon;
creating criminal offenses.

Right now, the Senate and House has appointed committee members to work together with the amendments added to the bill from the Senate. Contact both your Senate and House Representatives to ask them to support your freedom.

NICS and Gun Sales

Excerpt from NRA IRL (NRA-ILA | NICS Numbers Tell a Story (nraila.org))

"We usually look at NICS numbers on a month-to-month basis. We'd say something about how the NICS office conducted 3,514,070 total checks last month. We talk about how the latest batch is the most ever for that calendar month (it was) or how it was an about 21% increase over April 2020. We'd note that there were 961,947 handgun-related checks, 549,244 long gun related checks, and 602,540 permit checks last month. That's what we've done in past months, and we have quite a streak going."
