

Clothing Collection Bin

In the lower link we have a collection bin for clean, gently worn clothing, purses, belts and shoes that are donated to those in need. While we appreciate the donations, we continue to find items in the bin that we have no use for and thus result in us having to dispose of them which can be costly. Below is a detailed list of what we can/cannot accept.

In addition, we're in need of volunteers to help deliver the clothing. A commitment of approximately an hour every/every other week would suffice, Please contact the parish office for more information or with any questions pertaining to the clothing collection. Thank you.

We only accept:

- Clean, gently worn clothes in all sizes from birth to adult (If you have many bags of clothing we encourage you to take them directly to a donation center).
- Clean, gently worn belts, and shoes
- Clean, gently used purses (no broken clasps or zippers)



We cannot accept:

- Hair Spray/Cosmetics/Perfume
- Jewelry/Sun Glasses
- Toys/Sports Equipment
- Magazines/Books for Adults (Note: we do have a collection bin for children's books only)
- Art & Craft Supplies
- Pillows
- Light Bulbs
- Electronics
- Damaged clothing, i.e. holes, tears, or broken zippers
