Meeting Minutes

New England Rhodesian Ridgeback Club Board of Directors Meeting Helen McCune's Home, East Bridgewater, MA January 14, 2018

NERRC President Bonnie Johnson convened the meeting at 10:20 am.

The Secretary took attendance via roll call:

Secretary Report: Linda summarized previous Board actions:

- 12/5/17: Start searching for a Ridgeline editor for 2018
- 12/17/17: corrected minutes to be published in the next Ridgeline
- 12/15/17: order trophies for 2018 and 2019 Regional Specialties to get the 40% discount from Dedham Pottery in order to build the trophy fund.
- 12/22/17: the following applicants will be eligible to be voted on for membership

Treasurer Report: Alan

Balance as of year end (12/31/2017) was \$7,068.92. Alan will contact Julie Viveiros regarding an outstanding check. He will send out renewal reminders; after 1/31/2018, the person must re-apply for membership. There was some discussion about privacy of member's addresses/phones/emails. Unclaimed monies from supported shows will be split: 50% for rescue and 50% for the trophy fund; people can make unrestricted donations.

Lure Coursing: Nikki

Nikki reported profit for 2 events in 2017 to be about \$2,500. There was much discussion about the spring 2018 lure coursing event. Last year the mowing of the field was done late for the trial. Meghan located a potential field in Medfield owned by Medfield State Hospital. Suggestion was for a 3-day event probably for Memorial Day weekend (May 26-28). Suggested activities included 3 CATs(Coursing Ability Test), 2 JC/QCs (Junior Courser/Qualified Courser) and 2 Trials perhaps as follows:

- Sat: 2 CATs and one JC/QC
- Sun: one CAT and one Trial
- Mon: one JC/QC and one Trial

Some of the equipment needs maintenance. Some needs repairs. It was reported that Jay Gentile always brings an extra generator. We will need to buy more ribbons (eg, Best in Field, 'new title' ribbons); no decision was reached about offering trophies. Meghan will arrange for lure coursing blankets. Suggestions were offered:

- hold a training practice day
- contact the facility owner and town officials to ascertain any requirements/restrictions about RV overnight parking

• perhaps big dogs should be muzzled for BIF; if yes, such language should be on the entry form

Historical Records

Bonnie reported that the Historical Committee (Cathy Ford, chair, Jen Elliott and Stephanie D'Agostino) is working on organizing and archiving NERRC records going back to 1984 from charter member Kay Fanning, including copies of the original Ridgeline. The committee intends on scanning them and organizing the records.

Ways and Means: Rachel

The inventory is being reviewed to determine what is available. Most products are available for purchase at 50% off, excluding the slip leads that Meghan is making. A mold of our silver logo (designed by Diana Barrie) has been made; NERRC owns the mold.

Membership Cares Barbara

A welcome package should be developed to be sent to new members to include: membership card, calendar of events, Board of Directors members and contact information, newsletter.

Regional Specialty and Satellite Shows: Barbara

1) Barbara reported that the Regional Specialty Show will be September 15, 2018 with Supported Shows on September 13, 14, and 16. This cluster has received AKC approval. Evelyn Strawn will arrange for food. The committee is looking into getting donations of items for the Silent Auction and the Raffle. 2) A question was raised if the income from the Regional Show is our annual donation to Ridgeback Rescue. Consensus was that it was probably the easiest way to generate funds.

3) Rachel will make collars as trophies for Sweeps winners (puppy and veteran) for class winners, Best in Show Sweeps and Best of Opposite Sex; sponsor names to be published.

New Business:

1) Bonnie moved to bestow Honorary Membership for Ulla Britt Ekengren and Diana Barrie. M/S/P/ unanimously.

2) Helen moved to give Cheryl Fraser a 'thank-you gift' for her years of service to editing and publishing the Ridgeline. M/S/P 6 voting yea and one abstention (Alan Fraser).
