Thoughts From Hatton

New Testament Miracles

Miracles were not confined to the Old Testament alone. They were used in the New Testament. One of these was the healing of the man who was described as "sick of the palsy" (Mat. 9:1-8; Mark 2:1-12; Luke 5:17-26). Mark's account of this occasion provides much more information than Matthew and Luke do. Within Mark's writing, one will find insight into the mindset of the palsied man's friends. These men acknowledged that the situation was not ideal because "many were gathered together, insomuch that there was no room to receive them, no, not so much as about the door" (Mark 2:2). These men wanted nothing more than for their friend's healing; insomuch that they resorted to pulling the roof off the house where Jesus was (Mark 2:4). Now, this should be a beautiful demonstration of the effort Christians need to take in order to ensure the meeting of needs.

Another miracle that comes to mind is the changing of water to wine (John 2:1ff). This instance involves a wedding feast in Cana. Cana was the place where Jesus performed His first two miracles (Pfeiffer 203). According to Pfeiffer, there are two sites that "vie for the distinction of being the Biblical Cana. *Kefr Kenna*, the Cana of ecclesiastical tradition, is near Nazareth on the road to Tiberias and the Sea of Galilee" (Pfeiffer 203). The miracle is Jesus' taking regular water, and turning it into wine at a party after a wedding (John 2:8-9).

The apostles were tasked with using miracles. Mark goes into some detail as to what these miracles were. Mark 16:17-18 says: "And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover." All of these things fit the definition of a miracle, for they define known natural laws.
