

## **Sealing Up a Vintage Mustang (Part 1)**

One of the many things I've learned over the course of my very-long-in-the-tooth 1970 Mach 1 project is there's a lot involved with sealing up a classic Mustang. That is, keeping out moisture, exhaust and noise requires multiple sealers, gaskets and plugs. Let's a review a few.

#### Seam Sealer

Seam Sealer was used in great gobs on Mustang assembly lines. After application, it was typically brushed to smooth it down. You can recreate this same process with seam sealer in a caulking tube and an acid brush.

I've used the NAPA and Eastwood seam sealers and both work great. It's available in multiple colors. The NAPA sealer is more expensive, but readily available on the shelf at your local store. 3M also manufactures a high-end, two-part seam sealer requiring a special application gun.



The reproduction Weld and Sealant manual from Jim Osborn is very handy for illustrating all the right places to apply sealer. As you can see in the picture, my copy has seen a lot of use.



Be careful when smoothing the seam sealer. Some people say to brush on some lacquer thinner to help it smooth down. However, this can prevent some brands of seam sealer from properly hardening. Also, while seam sealer was applied directly over bare steel at the factory, I found a lot of rust under that sealer when I was stripping down my Mustang. Therefore, I applied seam sealer over the first coat of epoxy primer, followed by another coat of epoxy primer.

Below is a shot of the underside of my Mustang after applying seam sealer which you can see in the beige colored areas. After allowing adequate dry time, I shot on another coat of epoxy primer, followed by two coats of Eastwood's chassis black. (The bottom of my Mustang was painted black at the Dearborn factory.) Many areas inside the car also require seam sealer.



#### Fender and Quarter Extension Seals

Did you know seals are required for the fender extensions and quarter panel extension? Until recently, I didn't. They were completely missing from my car when I diassembled it. Reproduction seals are available and inexpensive. If you ever have the occasion to remove these pieces, I highly recommend ordering new seals. If yours are still in place after many years, likely they're in bad shape.



Here you can see the rubber strip seal from one of my quarter panel extensions. Not only does it help to keep moisture from collecting, it actually makes adjusting these parts much easier. I also ordered new fasteners from AMK. The nuts have rubber washers attached, but they are extremely soft and very delicate. I learned the hard way they can be installed only once. Removing them destroys the attached washers. I'll have to order another set for final assembly.

To the right is a closeup of the new fasteners for the quarter panel extensions. Not much left of the attached rubber washers! It's no surprise there was no trace of these rubber washers on the factory fasteners.





In the picture at left, the rubber strip seal is installed on the quarter panel extension. Notice each stud also has a rubber washer seal. Thus, when installed, there's a rubber washer on both sides of the taillight panel to ensure a good seal for keeping water out of the trunk. More importantly, these seals also keep exhaust fumes from entering the trunk and, eventually, the passenger compartment.

#### Strip Caulk

Another tool for sealing things up on a Pony is strip caulk. This stuff works especially well for the fuel tank. As you likely know, the fuel tank fills the very large hole at the bottom of a vintage Mustang trunk.

The 3M strip caulk comes in 12" sections. Lay them down end-to-end to form a continuous bead of caulk. It's a good idea to lay down two rows of strip caulk all way around the fuel tank sealing area. Here again, we're not only sealing out water, were sealing out exhaust. Strip also works well for floor pan plugs and firewall areas.
