South Fayette and Upper St. Clair will have joint fireworks on July 4 at 9:30 p.m. in Fairview Park.

Crafton's Fireworks in the Park will be held on July 4 starting at 4 p.m. with live music, food trucks and family activities. Fireworks at dusk.

Scott Township fireworks will be at 9:30 p.m. on July 4 at Scott Park.

Dormont Day will be Thurs., July 4 from 7-10 p.m. at the Dormont Pool parking lot and hillside. Food, drinks, live music and fireworks at 9:30 p.m.

Sweet Moments

This morning I stood on my porch watering the flowers in my yard, back and forth, rhythmically showering roses, daisies, pachysandra. A bird sang a loud melody. It was hot, so I watered my feet. I offered to spray a woman running by on the sidewalk. She laughed and kept on running. It was a very sweet moment. I came into the house smiling.

There are so many sweet moments in a day: the first swallow of a cup of coffee, the smile of a loved one, a text from a friend. But we often miss them. We are focused on getting things done. Checking off the items on our to-do list. We spend time feeling bad for something we said yesterday or strategizing how to solve a problem tomorrow.

Being Fully Present

Noting sweet moments experienced in real time - may be even more powerful than keeping a gratitude journal. For years therapists have recommended keeping a daily gratitude list as a way to elevate mood, to live more happily. And gratitude lists are wonderful. I know people whose lives have literally turned around 180 degrees from keeping gratitude lists.

But a gratitude list is usually written after the fact. Noting a sweet moment is done in the present moment. Sweet moments are deeply personal. They evoke emotions – joy, nostalgia, wonder – that resonate within us. Catch raindrops on your tongue or witness a butterfly emerge from its cocoon. These experiences give us delight and touch our souls.

Sweet moments surprise us. They're unscripted, like stumbling upon a wildflower in an unexpected corner. Their spontaneity makes them magical.

A Good Way to Live

When we note a sweet moment, we hold it close, feel its warmth, and connect with it instantly. Whether it's a smile from a stranger or the taste of a strawberry on the tongue, these moments bridge the gap between our hearts and the world.

Sweet moments accumulate like pebbles in a jar. Each one adds

weight to our emotional well-being. Over time, noting sweet moments becomes a habit. And the collected moments create a reservoir of positivity.

As we navigate life's labyrinth, let's open to the sweet moments – the dew-kissed grass, the interaction with a 3-year-old, the warmth of a loved one's hug. These moments, when savored, become our emotional anchors. They raise our mood, not just momentarily, but profoundly. Life's sweetness lies not in peak experiences, but in the delicate dance of everyday magic.

Know the limits of each card

Avoid unnecessary phone calls & plan accordingly to make the necessary arrangements before a purchase.

Set up account alerts

Have a record if anything should happen. If storing pics on your phone, be sure to password protect them.

Act quickly if you lose a card

The Fishin' Hole



Summertime and the living is easy. The fishing, on the other hand can become a little difficult. Temperatures during the last couple weeks of June this year were particularly high and were accompanied by some very dry conditions as well. Here are some summer fishing tips to help you battle the heat and still catch the fish. First, change when you fish. The sun comes up very early over the next month and, almost always, sunrise will be the coolest portion of the day. The old saying "The early bird catches the worm," could easily be changed to "The early angler catches the fish." Not only will the fish be more active

early in the morning, you will have less stress on yourself and your person from fighting the heat.


Night time fishing can be very fun and rewarding, too. Giant catfish are caught everywhere in our local rivers during the night all summer long. Safety first, should always be your motto when heading out for a night time excursion. Make sure you are familiar with the area you will be fishing in terms of how you can reach it when you are walking. Head lamps are excellent for giving you the use of two hands and also giving you some light to see for baiting your line and dealing with landed fish. Night time fishing will bring with it a peril maybe even worse than the dark, the dreaded mosquito. Nothing will ruin a night of otherwise fantastic fishing faster than being eaten alive by mosquitoes. Make sure you have a very good repellent and use it strategically. A hat that has been treated with mosquito repellent will be something you treasure as much as a really good bite on a night time outing to the river.

The fish will move to either deeper or cooler water in the daylight hours for the most part, but, they can also be found in faster moving water because the levels of oxygen will be increased in those areas.

As for yourself, make sure you have sunscreen and try to find a nice shady spot to fish. Stay hydrated and you will be less likely to tire in the heat. If you haven't wet-waded to go fishing yet, give it a try. A good pair of water shoes will get you to some spots you might not have been able to reach from the shore and being in the water can change a miserable, hot day into a refreshing, relaxing day of fishing.

The state will have a "Fish for Free Day" coming up his month on July the Fourth. If you are a new angler or just one that has taken some time off and did not buy a license this year, this is your chance to get out on the water without the expense of purchasing a license. Catching a nice fat walleye beats any fireworks display by a mile. Get out, keep those

Isshinryu Karate Academy Hosts World Tournament

In 1954, Tatsuo Shimabuku started Isshinryu Karate in Okinawa, Japan. In the 1960s, Hanshi William H. Duessel started Isshinryu Karate Academy to teach Isshinryu here, and the dojo has been located in Green Tree for 31 years. Youth classes are on Tuesday evenings and Saturday mornings. Adult classes are Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings. In this location there are 13 teachers and it is non-profit.

"One of the interesting things about this dojo is there are many high ranking dons, including two ninth degree black belts," explained Josh Mehl, a 5th degree black belt, who has been at the dojo since 1996.

On August 3rd Isshinryu Karate Academy is hosting a world tournament from 8:30 - 5:00 pm in downtown Pittsburgh at Wyndham Grand Hotel. So far there are 165 participants planning to attend, including from Asia and Europe. For more details on the tournament go to iwka2024.com.






