

This was a very special Recital. Besides being the first recital at the new venue, there were 5 students (level 9 and higher) that performed after a short intermission. The parents and students who stayed, were treated to some great performances from young artists.

Participating teachers included Shun-Lin "Sam" Chou, Laura Dickey, Adriana Manfredi, Lilia Pershina, Craig Richey, and Hannah Yi. Plan now to perform in the second Branch Recital on Saturday, February 25th!

Ensemble Festival is Around The Corner!

Sign up now for the festive and fun Ensemble Festival on December 10 at Newcomb Academy! Don't hold back because you think everyone might not fit on stage! The stage at our new venue is big enough to hold BIG ensembles! The deadline to register has been extended to December 3, and the entry fee is only \$6 per performer (including teachers and parents/family/friends). This is an informal event, so put together a group with whatever instruments are available (Sister's violin? Brother's accordion? tambourine, sleigh bells, wood block?) and join in the fun! Music of any type is acceptable, including holiday music. The start time and number of recitals depends on the number of entries; the auditorium is available from 10am – 2pm. Register and pay the entry fees online; teachers should collect fees from students and pay when registering (parents/students should not pay separately online since it makes it difficult to track who has paid). Note that registration is not complete until the entry fees have been paid.

"Sounds of Nature" Theme Festival

The annual Theme and Styles Festivals have been combined this year and will take place on January 14. This year we will use the same theme as the State Convention Theme recitals: "Sounds of Nature." Vocal and instrumental solos and ensembles are invited; teachers are welcome to perform as well. An adjudicator will provide written comments (optional for teacher performers).

Deadline is currently set at January 4, but may be extended slightly to allow everyone to recover from the holidays. Entry fee is \$11. Teachers should collect all entry fees from their students and pay online when they register their students (parents/students should not pay online themselves since it makes it difficult to keep track of who has paid). Note that registration is not complete until the entry fees are paid.

Accompanist Fee Help

DID YOU KNOW?

Do you hesitate to enter students in our local events because of professional accompanist fees? Standing rule #13 states that "Accompanist fees for all recitals may be paid in part by the Branch. Each student is allowed fifteen dollars (\$15) per recital to a maximum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) per teacher per academic year. This fee cannot be paid for Certificate of Merit evaluations. Contact Treasurer Mary Inui if you wish to take advantage of this allowance.

Harold Wheeler Memorial Concert and Scholarship Award

Each year, our teachers donate their time and talents to the Harold Wheeler Scholarship Recital to raise funds for the scholarships given from the Harold Wheeler Memorial Fund. This year's recital will take place at Newcomb Academy on January 28, 2017 at 4pm. Jeremie Favreau is organizing the program; contact him if you are interested in performing to see if space is still available. And don't forget to publicize the event to your student families and friends! How often do they get to hear YOU perform? How inspirational that can be! We generally ask attendees for a donation of \$10, but of course any donations are welcome even if you cannot attend.

If you have a senior student who might be interested in applying for the scholarship this year, send application materials to Dolly Ickler by April 1. Applicants will be asked to submit a formal application, a recording of the student performing two works of contrasting styles, and two letters of recommendation, which cannot be from the current MTAC teacher or from any family member of the teacher or student.

The scholarship recipient is selected based on the following criteria:

"The student must have used his or her musical gifts to enhance the lives of others in the school and community. The student must have proved attributes that include good scholarship, musicianship, and industry." (From Branch Standing Rule #14b)






