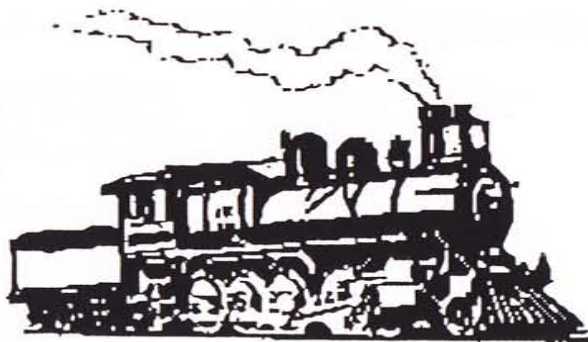
ON THE ROAD

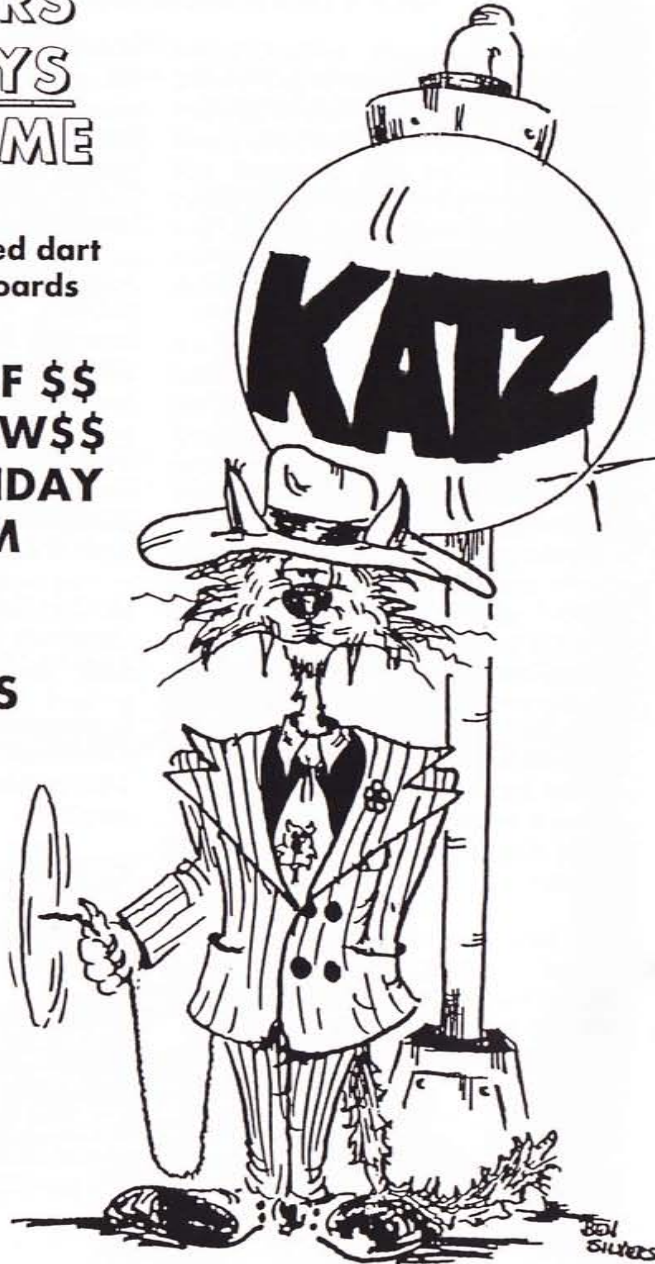

Thoughts....Darts

Plan to miss...

Now what kind of a thing is that to say while playing a game that you can't win if you miss...

Maybe I should say pick your first dart of an out shot carefully, so that if you don't hit the triple, you still have a two dart out...for example, what do you shoot first with 119 left? t20? no, because a single 20 leaves you 99 which requires 3 darts. You shoot t19; if you hit it, 62 remains which is either t10, d10 or 12, dbull; if you miss and hit a single 19, you have 100 left which is t20, d20 ... so many choices ... so keep in mind what may happen if you miss, but don't dwell on the miss because you will find yourself hitting the target that is foremost in your mind.

Practice up and only throw "smart" darts...Lou.



Pick A Target ... Any Target

Always be sure you are shooting at a particular target. Don't just shoot at the twenty; shoot at the triple 20; shoot at the middle of the trip 20.

What works best for me is to draw an imaginary x from the corners of the trip 20, I then shoot at the middle of this x. When I do this, it seems like I hit many more trip 20's than when I just shoot at the trip 20.

This works equally well for singles, many times, it is very critical to hit a single. How many times have you lost because you shot at the triple instead of the middle of the fat part of the number? Probably just as many as I have ... well this is one thing I am working on & I'll be wasting fewer darts in the future. I hope this helps your game as much as it has helped mine ... Lou.

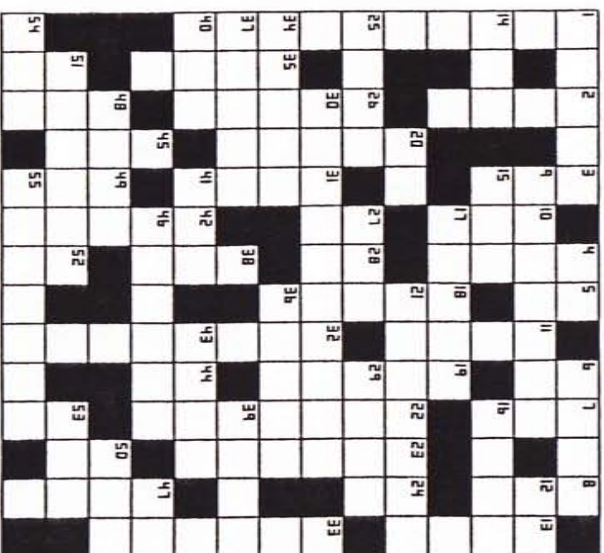
