Students have the opportunity to participate in several special events. As they seek and discover God’s truths throughout various subjects, they will then apply their discoveries in special projects, share them with others, and continue to gain a deeper understanding of them through purposeful field studies.

Special Events

Science Fair

Science Fair affords the students an outlet of inquiry that peeks their curiosity. Working through the Scientific Method from beginning to end, the result is a finished product they present to others. First and 2nd graders will work together to produce a class project. Third – 5th graders will work on individual projects, and all students from 3rd grade and up will compete at the Austin Regional Science Fair Festival if space allows.

History Museum

Depending upon the key historical era studied in a given grade level (2nd grade – Egypt, 3rd grade – Rome and Greece, and 4th grade – The Middle Ages/Renaissance), students will create a “museum” and furnish the exhibits. They may play a role by being part of the exhibit, or they may be a docent guiding a tour. Either way, all students will work on their public speaking skills as they deliver presentations. Accompanying the exhibits will be a taste of History in which food samples from each era will be provided.





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History TV

The History continuum will culminate with 5th grade (Early Explorers – 1815) as students will apply their technological skills in creating History TV.

Field Studies

Over the course of the student's time here at Sonlight Bay, they will visit such places as HEB, the Fire Department, the Capitol and Capitol Visitor's Center, Mayborn Science Theater, Mayborn Museum, the Thinkery, Bob Bullock State History Museum, Harry Ransom Center, Waco Zoo, Science Mill, and Wells Branch Homestead to name a few. As Extended Field Studies, 4th graders will visit the Texas Renaissance Festival, and 5th graders will visit the San Antonio Missions.

Students may choose to independently participate in the Scripts National Spelling Bee.
