“Hiking with Mass Audubon: Moose Hill”

Meet at visitor center. This is a hike. Venture along the trails of Borderland with Mass Audubon Moose Hill Teacher Naturalist, Michael Acciavatti, to take an in-depth look at how the forests of southern New England have changed over time. Walk through forests that once were pastures, search for large trees along stone walls, and even seek out a tree species that has all but disappeared, the American Chestnut. All trails we traverse will be on a level plane and easily accessible. If there is rain, we will ramble inside.
