

# Spike Gayfeather



This Native perennial adds some great color to the landscape. It thrives in both wet and dry soils and adds a nice vertical touch especially among low grasses. Gayfeather blooms for a long period and attracts bees, butterflies and hummingbirds. This plant has multiple medicinal uses. The leaves and roots can be utilized as a pot-pourri as well as an insect repellent

## *Liatris spicata*

- Hardiness Zone: 3-9
- Size: 2-3' with 1-2' flower head
- Flower: Pinkish-purple from mid to late summer
- Culture: Full sun to partial shade and wet to dry soils
- Uses: Cut flowers, border, rain garden, butterflies, hummingbirds, bees winter interest, deer resistant, medicinal, insect repellent, pot-pourri
