Traveling to Colombia?

A recent article in National Geographic Traveler said that if you want to experience the Colombia culture you would need to make sure you visited Valledupar.... The big event in the city is the Vallenato Legend Festival. Vallenato is Colombia's most emblematic folk music genre.

They also have a museum of the Accordion. When the Vallenato Legend Festival happens in April, the city of Valledupar takes their passion for the accordion to a whole new level as the top Vallenato musicians duel it out to be crowned the country's best accordion player.

Traditional Vallenato music fuses cultural expressions from northern Colombia, the songs of cow-herders of the Greater Magdalena region and the chants of African slaves with the traditional dance rhythms of the indigenous people of the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta. It reminded me of salsa and Mexican music fused.

A quote on the streets..."People here don't tell stories – we sing them with the sound of accordions." Colombian Vallenato music heavily features the accordion. Even without the accordion's hum filling your ears, its influence is everywhere. César's streets are littered with murals and monuments depicting the pleated instrument, and its wheezing melodies seemed to ooze from the glass with the dentures, in which

every open window.

Much like hip-hop, Vallenato has a competitive component in which two singers challenge each other in a battle of wits. The battle, or piqueria, requires humor and excellent improvisational skills, as the dueling participants take turns singing rapidly over the backing accordions. Improv skills!

It is the music that Gabriel Garcia Marquez danced to when he celebrated

winning his Nobel Prize for Literature in 1982, and he even described his most famous novel, 100 Years of Solitude, as a 400-page Vallenato. A quote from a published article written by Gabriel,
