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Pastor's Study **Desk Notes**



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

21st Sunday Ordinary Year B

"This saying is hard; who can accept it?" (In 6:60). Some people listening to Jesus, are struggling to understand/accept His teaching. We will even hear later in John 6:66, that "as a result of this, many disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied Jesus." It should not surprise us that some people reject Jesus. (He even told us that Himself -"If the world hates you, realize that it hated me first" Jn15:8) Yet, it also should not surprise us if WE happen to struggle with any one of Jesus' teaching. Count on it. Jesus came to bring new life to birth in us, and that means change (who likes change?) Change is never easy! And how does change occur, but by dying to one's old self to be born new? It means letting go and getting over some past way of living – maybe from once living selfishly only for ourselves to living in a new way completely for God and for others? How often we hear about such change when following Jesus-we must be open to continual conversion. Jesus says in John 3:3, "No one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." And in Matthew 18:3, He tells us, "Unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven." Again, is such change and being born again easy? No. In Luke 9:23, Jesus says, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me." The crux (cross) of change is sacrifice, service and giving of ourselves. Jesus describes this 'dying to self' in Mark 10:45, when He says "the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." That means 'laying down one's life for others" So, following Jesus and this whole call to repentance, change and conversion does not come easy. It shouldn't surprise us to hear that some people reject or turn away from Jesus because of His demand for sacrifice from us.

But we may be surprised at the specific teaching that they choose to reject Jesus over! Is it hard to accept that Jesus tells us He will be with us forever by allowing us to receive/consume His presence under the appearance of food and drink? That doesn't sound particularly hard to accept as a matter of faith. Jesus can surely make that happen! Belief in Jesus' Real Presence, and the fact that we consume His Body and Blood when we receive Holy Communion is no more difficult to believe than any of His other miracles that we readily accept. This is the same Jesus who I believe walked on water (Mt 14:26), calmed the stormy sea (Mk 4:39), multiplied loaves and fish (Matt 14:19), turned water to wine(Jn 2:9) and even brough the dead back to life (Jn 11:43). So why would I balk at believing that he could give me His very life (Body & Blood) under the appearance of bread and wine? He says it. and I believe it. If it is not just His words here in John chapter 6 that specifically identify His gift of life as His Body and Blood, then I can also hear Him say this in His Last Supper statements in Matthew 26:26-28, Mark 14:22-24, Luke 22:19-20, and 1 Corinthians 11:23-25, where He plainly tells us, 'This is my Body' & 'This is my Blood'. So, if Jesus said it, then I accept it, for it refers to believing what He can do for me! I would never limit what God can do, or question how God may choose to come into the life of a believer.

But if you start asking me how I respond to His gift and how I am changed by the Holy Eucharist, then we are getting into what may be difficult for me? If I am asked "Do you find any of Jesus' teaching hard to accept and follow?", I have to confess that I might find other words of Jesus a lot more challenging than these. Oh, what are those other words of Jesus that I find hard to follow? How about "You must forgive, not seven times but seventyseven times' (Matt 18:22) Or "love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you (Matt 5:44). Or "In the same way, everyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple (Lk 14:33). Or "How narrow the gate and constricted the road that leads to life. And those who find it are few" (Matt 7:14). Or "The greatest among you must be the slave of all" (Mk 9:35). Or even "Judge Not" (Matthew 7:1). For me, these are more difficult words to hear and accept from Jesus, because they directly call me to act and embody what it is, I am accepting. These words of His focus on what I am to do in response to Jesus, instead of just focusing on what Jesus does for me. These words, demand action of me. They call me to give and give and give in His Name! Not easy, but that is the cross of Jesus. That is what 'follow me' means from Jesus! Peace. Fr Brian


