

Abiding in the "Silent Saturdays" of Faith -------- With Pastor Eric

³¹Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. – Mark 8:31

⁵¹Listen, I will tell you a mystery! We will not all die, but <u>we will all be</u> changed, - I Corinthians 15:51

The Saturday between Good Friday and Easter is sometimes known as "silent" Saturday. What happens in that "in between" time? I believe that after Jesus' crucifixion the disciples had to find a place to bury him quickly before the Sabbath began. Joseph of Arimathea offered his burial tomb at such short notice. After they buried him, the women observed at a distance and a Roman guard was stationed to keep the body from being stolen. Silence follows in the gospel accounts, and we read nothing until the next morning when the women go out to the tomb and stuff started happening! I expect that many of the disciples did observe the sabbath and gathered to grieve, question the events, and fret a bit about what's next for them. I'm sure that much happened in this time as well!


I find myself in that "silent" Saturday place quite often in my faith and it is not a comfortable place to be. It's a time off loss and confusion — this "in between" time. In our Christian tradition we are invited into the Easter Vigil which basically chronicles in order the promises (covenants) of God with us from Genesis onward. We are reminded of God's faithfulness as we face the emptiness or pain of this "silent" Saturday and reflect on the "new covenant" established in Jesus' body and blood given and shed for us. This is hard which might be why many people don't think about it or find busy work to move through this period as quickly as possible. I propose that "silent" Saturday is when

transformation happens like a chrysalis for a caterpillar/butterfly. Perhaps not so much physically but spiritually.

I am thinking about a young boy who was burned badly in a bus accident. He was in extreme pain and covered with severe burns over 65% of his body. After a couple of weeks, the hospital sent in a teacher to help him from falling too far behind in school. When the teacher saw how bad he was and his pain levels, she was reluctant to do the drills and give him homework. The teacher stumbled through the lessons, and the boy struggled to respond. The next day a nurse came to that teacher and asked, "What did you do to that boy? We have been worried about him. But ever since you were here yesterday, his whole attitude has changed. He's fighting back. He's responding to treatment. It's as if he's decided to live."

The boy explained later that he had completely given up hope until that teacher walked into his room. With joyful tears the boy said, "They wouldn't send a teacher to work with a boy who was dying, would they?"

This story is a "silent" Saturday story for me. It invites us to celebrate the gift of life even when all we seem to see around us is pain, disappointment, and brokenness. On the other side of pain, there is resurrection life and all that is possible with hope in a faithful and loving God on our side. Amen.







My First Hundred Years

Sister Jean is a sister of Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. I learned she has an Iowa connection. She enrolled at the Mount Carmel

Motherhouse in Dubuque, Iowa. It is still there today. She became a teacher and had to move and change positions teaching different grades at different schools and worked her way up to being principal. She found it best to be flexible and said, "We need to be at least a little uncomfortable in order to grow."

She came from a large family and was very sociable and loved all the students she worked with over the years. She is most well known for her position of chaplain of the men's basketball team at Loyola. She got noticed cheering them on from the sidelines. In 2018 Loyola made it into the NCAA tournament all the way to the Sweet 16 and in 2021 Loyola made it to the Final Four. She always prays with them before every game. She is now 103 and still works at Loyola and feels it is important to have a purpose. Sister Jean has a positive attitude and believes that God made each of us out of love.
