HOLY WEEK

Toly Week is the week which precedes the great feast of the Resurrection of the Lord on Easter Sunday. The week begins with Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, includes the last days of Lent, and ends on Holy Saturday with the beginning of the Easter Vigil. During Holy Week, the Church celebrates the mysteries of salvation accomplished by Christ in the last days of his life on earth, beginning with his messianic entrance into Jerusalem and culminating with his Passion and Death on the Cross. Though Holy Week is solemn and sorrowful, it anticipates the Easter joy of Christ's resurrection which brings new life to all who believe.

Sunday Theme

The beginning of today's Mass recalls the I messianic entrance of the Lord Jesus into Jerusalem, coming to complete his Paschal Mystery. In the Passion Narrative we see the model for all love - the sacrificial love of Jesus which continues to be available for each of us. This



love is made manifest as Jesus, the Suffering Servant, heals the injured slave in the Garden of Gethsamene, comforts the weeping women, forgives his executioners, and welcomes the repentant thief. Jesus' love culminates in his death on the cross for our salvation. Such great love ought to guide our personal and communal life as Christians and as Church.

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

"Six days before the solemn Passover, the Lord came to Jerusalem, and children waving palm branches ran out to welcome him. They loudly praised the Lord:


Blessed are you who have come to us, so rich in love and mercy. Open wide the doors and gates, lift high the ancient portals. The King of glory enters. Who is the King of glory? He is God the mighty Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

"Blessed are vou who have come to us. So rich in love and mercy". Amen.

THE SACRED PASCHAL TRIDUUM

Through his Paschal Mystery, the Lord Jesus redeemed the human race and A gave perfect glory to the Father. By dying, Christ destroyed our death, by rising, he restored our life. For this reason, the Easter Triduum, when we celebrate the suffering, death and resurrection of our Lord, is the high point of the Liturgical Year. The Easter Solemnity is to the year what Sunday is to the week.

The celebration of the *Triduum* (Latin word for 'three days') opens with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, continues through Good Friday and Holy Saturday, reaching its climax in the Easter Vigil, and closes with Evening Prayer II on Easter Sunday. During these days, we gather a number of times and we hear some of the Church's most beautiful prayers and Scripture readings. There are two important points to keep in mind regarding the Triduum:



- First, it is the highpoint of the liturgical year, an event which, though it spans three days, is really **one** major unified celebration.
- Secondly, the focus from start to finish is on "the glory of the Cross". This defining theme, inherent throughout the Triduum, is first expressed in the entrance antiphon of Holy Thursday's Mass: "We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered." These words set the tone for the whole Triduum event – we gather "to glory in the Cross of Christ".

Day 1 (Holy Thursday evening to Good Friday evening: The Church celebrates "Christ as Sacrifice" as Christ offers his Body and Blood at the Last Supper on Holy Thursday and then on the Cross of Calvary on Good Friday.

Day 2 (Good Friday evening to Holy Saturday evening): The Church is united with "Christ in the Tomb". There is no principal liturgical celebration. On this day the Lord sleeps: on this day we wait at the Lord's tomb and make every effort to enter into God's rest. Prayer, fasting, and silence are the order of the day.

Day 3 (Holy Saturday evening to Easter Sunday evening): The Church celebrates "Christ Being Raised Up". "Alleluias" ring out in welcome to our Risen Saviour. There is joy in Christ's journey from death to life, a journey we hope to share with Him.

GOOD FRIDAY Paschal Fast

narishioners are reminded of the Paschal Fast which should be observed everywhere on Good Friday and continued, where possible, on Holy Saturday. The Fast honors the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus. In this way the people of God will receive the joys of the Lord's Resurrection with uplifted and responsive hearts.

We are invited to participate in exploring how our Church is carrying out its mission, how it has strayed from its journey, and how changes can be made to bring it back to its mission to witness to the Gospel.

We have been invited, through this synod to assist our Church to fulfil her mission more fruitfully of evangelization in the world at the service of the coming of God's kingdom.
