Gaming News

BRITISH COLUMBIAN SCANDAL PROBED

According to Canadian media, new details are emerging about how organized crime may have first made its way into British Columbia's casinos. A former supervisor who worked for Great Canadian in Richmond, BC, in the mid '90s and early 2000s has come forward with a journal detailing what she claims to have seen on the casino floor. The whistle-blower claims that when the casino increased its bet limits on some games from \$25 to \$500 per hand the clientele changed, and that many of these high stakes gamblers were accompanied by women who seemed to serve as "human ATMs."

BIG ACQUISITION IN UK ONLINE GAMING

The company Better Collective says it has has acquired the sports betting site mybettingsites in a deal that is worth more than two-and-a-half million dollars. The betting comparison site, formed in 2015, says it plans to double its revenues this year. The company offers a service where it compares betting sites.

ONLINE REVENUES DOWN IN SPAIN

Regulators in Spain report that that country's second quarter gross gaming revenue fell 8% over the previous quarter. The experts attribute the drop to an increase in sports betting, which represents 48.5% of the total. Additionally, Bingo saw a fall in gross profits of about 6%. Spain is among those nations seeing

a slow change in the way the "betting pie" is cut up since the increase in sports betting.

NW INDIANA AWAITS NEW CASINO

It will likely be Christmastime 2020 before it opens, but talk of a Hard Rock Casino coming to Gary, Indiana, is loud and exciting. Plans call for visitors to pass by a huge neon-lit guitar at the main entrance to the first land-based casino in Northwest Indiana. The plans also call for a marble walkway through the center of the casino, with numerous table games and thousands of slot machines on each side, surrounded by a variety of bars and restaurants. The casino will feature a 2,000-seat performance

Caller Snaps at Bingo

Hi Guy,

A lot of us Bingo players have been at this a long time and have certain "traditions" that are innocent and fun. One of them is giving the caller a bit of a hard time when he/she is calling the "wrong" numbers...that is, the numbers other players are looking for and not the ones we want.

Of course, sometimes players get frustrated because they are having a bad night and will take it out on the caller with more direct and pointed comments that are less on the "fun" side and more along the lines of "snippy." But even these people mostly know where to draw the line and limit their jabs to complaining about the caller being too slow, too chatty, or needing to do something so the same "wrong" numbers don't keep coming up all the time.

I give callers credit for taking the friendly (and not-so-friendly) ribbing in stride, understanding that it comes with being the most public person and easiest target during Bingo.

I must admit that I'm a little surprised that grumpy players going after callers who are just trying to do their jobs doesn't result in regular shouting matches and the occasional flying dauber.

We had an incident at Bingo

recently that got out of hand in just this way. It started as one player being unhappy with his card numbers and ribbing the caller about it. Then a second player joined in and the two took turns heckling the caller, who was a good caller, very popular with the players, and had been working at this hall for almost two years.

You could tell that the two players were getting on the caller's nerves, but she did her best not to let it show. Then she made the mistake of removing the next ball (I-21) from the chute (which everyone had seen on the monitor) and calling I-27 by mistake.

Needless to say, there was a loud burst of objections from the players because everybody knew the wrong number had been called. It was an innocent mistake, of course, but the complaints from players kept going on and on... probably because there had already been tension in the air from the two men who were giving the caller such a hard time earlier on.

The caller had an advantage over the situation because she had the microphone—and boy did she use it! She tore into the players about how childish they had been since the start of Bingo, and how ridiculous they were being now. She then called them a roomful of "Bingo bitches and bastards" and stomped across the stage and through the side door. The place went dead silent.

After a few minutes someone else took over the caller's seat, officially corrected the I-21 error, and moved on with the rest of the session. The original caller never reappeared, and the substitute caller didn't hear another peep out of us bitches and bastards.

Bingo ended about 30 minutes later, and you never saw a hall empty so fast in your life. We're all very curious to see what's going to happen next. — **Karl the Bingo Bastard, via email**

Hi Karl,

I've seen my share of skirmishes at Bingo over the years, typically between players or between a player and the hall manager. But never have I seen a caller grab the microphone and take on the whole hall!

I'm curious if this happened at a charity or a for-profit Bingo hall. If it is for profit, then that caller probably collects a salary and/or tips and may have put her job in jeopardy. If it is charity and she is a volunteer, then she can walk away or stay, without financial hardship being part of the dynamic.

Clearly people on both sides of the caller's stand hold some blame for the incident. But in my opinion, the caller's reaction was extreme—name-calling and storming off the stage—which may just cost her this job.

Keep us posted on what happens next! — Guy

Reducing the Rate of Military Suicides

In a joint venture to reduce suicides, the Department of Veterans Affairs, the Department of Defense and the Vet Centers have hooked up to provide counseling and outreach to the National Guard on drill weekends and during training. In 2017, the National Guard had the highest rate of suicide of all the military.

Now, however, the rate of National Guard members using the Vet Centers has risen 38%, and the suicide rate has fallen to its the lowest level in five years. It's thought that the increased use of the Vet Center services could be the reason.

Meanwhile, the Defense Suicide Prevention Office's most recent report saw 2018 deaths-by-suicide numbers that were mostly higher than the year before: Air Force 60, Army 139, Marine Corps 58, Navy 68, Reserves 216 and National Guard 135.

As the VA continues to try to understand the reasons for veteran suicides, it's looking at limited access to health care and isolation. Up until 2016, Vermont had the nation's highest rate of veteran suicide. By this year, it was reported in Congress that Montana had the highest rate. First thoughts point to rural living and cold weather, yet in California, sunny and warm San Diego has the highest rate for that state.

If you think you might be in trouble, or if you know a veteran who is, call the Veterans Crisis Hotline 24/7 at 1-800-273-8255 or go online to www.veteranscrisisline.net. You also can send a text to 838255.

Besides the 24/7 hotline, National Guard and Reservists are eligible to use the services of the Vet Centers (there are 300) and Mobile Vet Centers (there are 80). Electric Bikes are Booming **Among Boomers**

Dear Savvy Senior,

What can you tell me about electric bicycles? A friend of mine, who's almost 70, recently got one and absolutely loves it. He told me he rides more now than he ever did his regular bicycle. -**Interested Boomer**

Dear Interested,

Electric bikes have become very popular among U.S. baby boomers over the past few years because they're super fun to ride and easier on an aging body.

Electric bikes, also known as e-bikes, are conventional bicycles with a battery-powered "pedal" or "throttle" assist. When you saddle up and push the pedals or throttle, a small motor engages and gives you a boost, so you can whiz up hills, ride into headwinds and cruise over challenging terrain without gassing yourself or taxing your knee joints.

Many older e-bike riders say that they ride more frequently and go further and longer than they ever would with a traditional bike. Here's what you should know about e-bikes, along with some tips to help you choose one.

What to Know

E-bikes are more complicated and expensive than regular bicycles, so you need to do some research before you purchase one. For starters, you need to know that there are three different types of e-bikes to choose from:

- Class 1: "Pedal-assist" electric bikes that only provides assistance when the rider is pedaling, and only up to 20 miles per hour. These are the most common type of electric bikes.
- Class 2: "Throttle-assist" e-bikes that let you use the electric motor without pedaling, like a motorcycle or scooter, but only up to 20 miles per hour.
- Class 3: "Speed pedal-assist" e-bikes, similar to Class 1, except that the motor will assist with bike speeds of up to 28 miles per hour.

Because they're electrically powered, states and local communities have varying regulations regarding the use of e-bikes. In many states, class one and two e-bikes are allowed to be ridden wherever a traditional bike goes, while class three are generally allowed on the street due to their higher top speed. For more information on your state's e-bike laws, visit PeopleForBikes. org/e-bikes.

You should also know that e-bikes come in many different styles - commuter, cruiser, mountain, road, folding, etc. just like traditional bikes to meet different riding needs. They also run on rechargeable lithium-ion batteries, and their motors are either hub-driven mounted on the front or rear wheel, or middrive motors that are mounted to the frame at the bottom bracket between the cranks.

The only downsides of e-bikes are weight and cost. Because of the battery and motor, e-bikes are much heavier than traditional bicycles weighing 50-plus pounds, so it can be more challenging if you have to manually lift or maneuver your bike a lot. And e-bikes are expensive, typically ranging between \$2,500 and \$3,500.

E-bikes are made by many of the same established companies that make traditional bikes like Specialized, Electra, Schwinn, Trek, Giant, Cannondale and Felt, along with a number of upstarts like Juiced Faraday, Pedego, Elby and Hi Bike. To shop for an e-bike, find some good bike shops in your area that sell them so you can test ride a few.

If you're interested in a cheaper option, there are also e-bike kits you can purchase at places like Walmart, Amazon.com and eBikeKit.com that can convert your regular bike into an e-bike for a few hundred dollars.

The 50th annual World Series of Poker at the Rio in Las Vegas culminated with the \$10,000-buy-in No-Limit Hold'em World Championship, better known as The Main Event. This year's edition attracted 8,569 players, making it the second-largest Main Event in WSOP history.

It took 10 long days for a winner to emerge, and the tournament ended in a memorable hand. It happened in Level 43 (blinds of 2 million-4 million, plus a 4 million ante), on the 301st hand of the final table. That's when Hossein Ensan raised to 11 million with Kh Kc, and Dario Sammartino defended his big blind with 8s 4s.

The 10s 6s 2d flop was interesting, as it gave Sammartino a flush draw. Nonetheless, he checked and opted to just call a bet of 15 million from Ensan, who was still ahead with his pocket kings (also known as "cowboys").

After the dealer burned and turned the 9c, Sammartino checked for the second time, and Ensan kept the pressure on with a bet of 33 million. Sammartino, who picked up a gutshot straight draw to a seven, then sprung to life with an all-in check-raise for 140 million.

In poker, "fold equity" is the equity players can expect to gain due to their opponent(s) folding to a bet. Here, Sammartino didn't have a made hand, but if Ensan didn't either, then perhaps Sammartino could get him to fold by check-raising all in. His fold equity was tied to his chances of success.

Some players might have been deterred by the shove, but not Ensan. He snap-called and was one card away from winning poker's most prestigious title. According to the math, Ensan was a 72.7 percent favorite to win the hand, while Sammartino had a 27.3 percent chance of hitting one of his outs, which included any spade or seven.

The dealer burned one last time and put out the Qc on the river. Sammartino missed and had to settle for second place, though he had \$6 million in prize money to help ease the pain.

"It is the best feeling I have in all my life," the 55-year-old champion said.

Ensan, who was born in Iran but moved to Germany 30 years ago, had achieved the pinnacle of poker success after taking up tournament poker just six years earlier.

"I am so happy," Ensan said in a post-victory interview. "I thank my fans at home in Germany, also in Iran, and my fans, my buddies here. This is the best feeling in my life. Unbelievable! I am so happy, I'm here with the bracelet in hand. What can I say?"

What the poker world had to say after the fact was that the new champion had kept his composure, played well, used well-timed aggression to his benefit, and was fully deserving of the victory.

Congratulations to Hossein Ensan on becoming the 2019 WSOP Main Event champion and taking home a prize of \$10 million.

The Flamingo in Las Vegas reports that a Wisconsin man won \$1.3 million playing a Let It Ride progressive slot machine. The winner is a frequent visitor to Las Vegas. The win marks the eighth time in recent months that a player has won at least \$1-million while playing table games at Caesars properties in Nevada.





Turkey Transformed

Dear Annie,

I know this request is a little early, but I would like to know what to do with my leftover turkey bones. Please help me! I will be having a large turkey for my family, probably at least 20 pounds. Thanks. — **Tricia T. from Tennessee**

Dear Tricia,

Many years ago I lost a good friend. Her husband gave me her entire collection of cookbooks. Here is a recipe from her for turkey soup that I am sure you will like. — **Annie**

TURKEY SOUP

Turkey Stock

Bones and carcass from leftover turkey

- 8 peppercorns
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 6 whole cloves
- 6 sprigs parsley
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 3 ribs celery, diced
- 1 carrot, diced

Break the carcass into small pieces and put in a stockpot or large kettle with all the remaining ingredients for the turkey stock. Add 4 quarts of cold water and bring to a boil. Reduce the heat at once and simmer uncovered for 2 1/2 to 3 hours, or until reduced by half. Strain. Cool uncovered and refrigerate until ready to use. Remove the fat. The heated broth may be served as is, used as turkey stock, or used as a base for turkey soup.

Turkey Soup

3 large onions, chopped fine
3 ribs celery, chopped fine
2 carrots, peeled and chopped
2 sticks butter (1/2 pound)
1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
3 quarts turkey stock
2 cups light cream
salt and pepper
1/2 cup finely diced cooked turkey
(I would add more, if available)
1/4 cup cooked rice

Cook the onions, celery and carrots in a little water in a saucepan for 20 minutes or until tender. Set aside. In a large heavy pan, melt the butter and thoroughly blend in the flour over a low heat. Heat the turkey stock and cream. Add very gradually to the butter-flour mixture, stirring with a whisk until the lumps disappear. Add the reserved vegetables, the water in which they were cooked, and the seasonings. Taste and correct the seasoning. Add the turkey and rice. Serve in large bowls. Makes 3 quarts of soup.
