



# 2020 Robie Pierce One-Design Regatta

## Notice of Race

### 1 RULES

- 1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS), and the Ideal 18 Class Rules, except as they are altered by the sailing instructions.
- 1.2 RRS Appendix T, Arbitration, as modified in the sailing instructions will apply.
- 1.3 **PENALTY SYSTEM** - The Scoring Penalty, RRS 44.3, will apply.

### 2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 No competitor advertising will be permitted.
- 2.2 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the OA.

### 3 ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 All disabled sailors are eligible to compete.
- 3.2 Each boat shall have a skipper and crew who are disabled, plus one able bodied (AB) member whose sole responsibilities will be for ballast and to perform physical functions the crew cannot. No coaching by ABs will be allowed.
  - a) No sailor classified as Group 3 according to WS Regulation 22 shall be allowed to sail as an AB.
  - b) Participants are encouraged to provide their own ABs; but for those participants unable to provide an AB, the OA will provide one if requested no later than Friday, May 22, 2020.

### 4 ENTRIES AND FEES

- 4.1 Eligible skippers may enter by registering online at [www.robiepiercedesignregatta.com](http://www.robiepiercedesignregatta.com) For registration questions, call Siobhan Reilly at 914-329-2761.
- 4.2 Entry deadline is 1700, Friday, May 22, 2020.
- 4.3 The entry fee of \$175 per sailor is payable online to Larchmont Yacht Club through Pay Pal. Entries received after May 22 will be charged an additional \$25 per sailor. The fee for ABs provided by participants will be \$100. Additional tickets may be purchased for all regatta food, beverages and functions for \$175 per person payable online or at registration.
- 4.4 Each skipper will provide a \$500 refundable damage deposit payable to Larchmont Yacht Club at registration for insurance purposes.

### 5 CLASSES

- 5.1 Races will be conducted in Ideal 18s provided by the OA with appropriate adaptations. All boats are to be sailed as provided by the OA with the exception of pre-approved personal adaptations that may need to be added by a sailor for his or her safety and comfort while sailing.
- 5.2 Boats will be randomly assigned by the OA and then adapted reflecting the specific needs of that skipper and crew and sailed by that pair for the entire regatta. In the case of a serious breakdown of equipment, a spare boat may be substituted by the OA for the original boat.

## 8 RACING AREA

The racing area will be in the waters off Larchmont Harbor.

## 9 COURSES

Courses will be windward-leeward as described in the sailing instructions.

## 10 SCORING

10.1 One completed race constitutes a series.

10.2 The race committee intends to run multiple races. If fewer than five races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

10.3 If five or more races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

10.4 Boats sailing any races with only one disabled sailor (and two ABs) will be assessed a 20% scoring penalty for those races.

## 11 PRIZES

11.1 Prizes will be awarded at the conclusion of racing on Sunday, May 31.

11.2 Prizes will be awarded for first through fifth place.

11.3 Additional prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the OA.

## 12 ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION

Each team shall provide and carry a radio capable of transmitting and receiving on VHF Channel 1a.

Except in an emergency, physical need or to report a withdrawal, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones and data communication.

### **13 DOCKAGE AND LAUNCHING**

Boats will be available at the dock each morning. All boats shall remain in the water for the duration of the regatta unless the OA deems it necessary to haul a boat for repair.

### **14 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

By registering for this event, the owner and person in charge of the boat agree with the following:

- 1) My crew and I recognize that sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury associated with it. We have read rule 4, Decision to Race, and hereby acknowledge and agree that we are participating in this event entirely at our own risk.
- 2) I acknowledge and agree that neither the organizing authority nor the race committee, nor their members will be responsible for:
  - a) any damage to the entered boat or my other property, or
  - b) any injury to my crew or me, including death, sustained as a result of our participation in this event.
- 3) I hereby waive any rights I may have to sue the race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors or any other organization or official) with respect to personal injury or property damage suffered by my crew or me as a result of our participation in this event, whether on the water or on shore, and hereby release the race organizers from any liability for such injury or damage to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 4) I have taken all necessary steps to ensure that my crew and I and my entered boat are adequately prepared for all possible contingencies, including carrying and using appropriate safety equipment as may be required by law, racing rules and that a prudent seaman would consider advisable.

**I agree to be bound by all rules that govern this event. I will inform all crewmembers of the conditions stated herein for their participation in such racing.**

### **15 HOUSING AND TRANSPORTATION**

- 15.1 Competitors are responsible for arranging their own housing and transportation.
- 15.2 Limited housing is available in member homes for those without adaptive needs. Housing Request forms can be found on the website at: [www.robiepiercedesignregatta.com](http://www.robiepiercedesignregatta.com). Deadline for housing requests is 1700, Friday, May 8, 2020.
- 15.3 A limited number of special rate rooms have been reserved at nearby hotels. Reservations must be made no later than May 16, 2020 to ensure the rates.
