WORSHIP AND PRAYER

Everyday Stewardship:

When I was a child, I can remember stopping by my parish or another local Catholic church to just spend some time in prayer before the Holy Eucharist. We didn't have exposition and adoration much in those days, but we were keenly aware of the presence of Jesus in the tabernacle. I would sometimes stare at the lighted candle near it and know that Jesus was alive.

It wasn't until I was an adult, and after acquiring two theology degrees, that I understood both with my head and my heart what a stewardship way of life really meant. But I look back at those days, and I realize that the groundwork was laid for me to understand these things. It was those times before the Holy Eucharist that I began to understand true sacrifice. It was at those times that I began to understand how actions and realities that seem so simple to the human eye can be so profound. And it was at those times that I began to see true love knows no bounds.

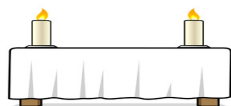

This Sunday is the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ or Corpus Christi; the most difficult and most beautiful mystery of our Faith. Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Luke 9:11b - 17

“... He said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to give to the crowd.” None of the Gospels tell the exact details of how four or five thousand men, plus women and children, are fed with a few loaves and fish. The Church teaches us that the miracle of the multiplication of loaves and fishes was a prefiguration of the Body and Blood of Jesus. But let us consider another miracle just as great. Jesus knew the Semitic ethic that required people to share with others. He knew people carried food and wine under their garments, but refrained from taking it out for fear others had brought their own. Note that Jesus blessed the loaves and fish and gave them away. He did not keep any for himself. Did people see his generous act and decide to share what they had with one another? In the context of God’s gifts to us of reason and free will - the ability to choose to be generous or not to be generous, what is the greater miracle: multiplication of loaves and fish, or multiplication of generous hearts? Which makes us a greater witness to the Real Presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Eucharist?

“I think the Burmese community can teach the rest of us in our parish how to be a family again,” Sister Suzanne said. “They are all about family. They don’t spend money on anything that isn’t important to the family. It’s taught me the people who have less are the happiest. I profess poverty, but it’s taught me to continually examine myself.”

Deacon Stephen – who will be ordained a priest in 2020 – arrived in the Diocese of Owensboro in 2017 from native Myanmar (Burma) to serve the burgeoning Burmese community in the diocese. Deacon Stephen was assigned to St. Pius for the summer.

“Every family has their own prayer center in their home, based on their culture,” he said. “Most people have a picture of the Sacred Heart. We call it a ‘home altar.’ When we enter a Burmese home, we take off our shoes and we usually sit on the floor. We never turn our back to the home altar, and we never stretch out our legs when we face it, we sit with our legs folded.”
