As groups like Boko Haram and ISIS threaten to spread violence far beyond North and West Africa, church leaders in Central Africa are organizing to form a line of prayer that reaches from the east to the west coast of the African continent. Nigel Warr, the regional leader of Emmaus Ministries in Africa explains, "Church leaders had a vision to develop a barrier to stop ISIS from spreading further south, and they identified The Walk to Emmaus as a leadership development program to create leaders in Central Africa and to encourage people to get more involved and spread the word of Christ in this region." Over the past two years, donations to "The Gift" provided scholarship funds and helped cover travel and lodging expenses to launch Emmaus communities in Africa, Central America, and South America.
