

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

Parish Council: Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.

Holy Name Society: Meets on the Monday evening after the second Sunday of the month. President, Joseph Chimenti

Rosary Altar Society: Meets on the Monday evening after the first Sunday of the month. President, Liz Mulvaney

HOW CAN I BE MORE FORGIVING?

When God comes down form the heavens and speaks to Moses,



putting words to the divine essence, those words are not words describing unparalleled qualities like "omnipotent," all-knowing," or "almighty," though any of those words would be correct. But they would be inadequate. Instead, the words God uses are relational: "merciful," "gracious," "slow to anger," "rich in kindness and fidelity." (Exodus 34:6). God is a relational being. Moses would not have realized it at the time, but even then God was not relational only with all creation, but also with the Son and the Holy Spirit. God

has always been three persons in one God.

The mystery of the Trinity is a mystery we cannot hope to truly penetrate with our limited human intelligence and from our limited human perspective. But this makes perfect sense. A God who can be fully explained is a God who is less than our intelligence.

Throughout the Old Testament God forgives the Chosen People for their unfaithfulness, for the many times they turn away from God, for their sinfulness. Jesus personifies that infinite mercy, given by God to us in two ways. The Son given over to death on

the cross, redeeming us from our sinfulness. Our God is a forgiving God. We again see this in the New Testament, in the way that Jesus treats sinners in the Gospels, leading to His willingness to sacrifice His life for sinners. His forgiveness is not distant or




impersonal. He gets to know sinners intimately, which leads to Him loving them more deeply, which leads to forgiveness that is true and real. We would do well to strive to do the same.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:

What concrete actions can I take to be a more forgiving person? Can I overcome my insistence that those whom I forgive be deserving of it?

Where is that guy with the rainbow wig holding a "John 3:16" sign in the end zone at NFL football games? Younger readers may not have any idea what I am talking about! You used to see this guy on TV all the time wearing "Jesus Saves" shirts and holding his sign. Most thought he was a harmless guy, but now he is serving multiple life sentences for taking hostages at a hotel near LAX in 1992.
