gave a copy to each of his friends mentioned in his memoir.

I am pleased to announce that Marybeth Jacobsen has agreed to be our new Librarian. Thank you to her for stepping up and volunteering for that position.

TREASURER'S REPORT AS OF JUNE 30, 2024

There were no reserve expenses in June, and the amount in the reserve fund was still in good shape at \$562,305.04. At the July 18 Board meeting, we decided to start investing in CDs with Heritage Bank. It offers a CD purchase program, called the IntraFi Network, that simplifies the selection and renewal of CDs, while generally offering better rates and a wider variety of maturity dates than what I can find on my own. And, yes, we would still have FDIC coverage. We will dip our financial toe in the water by investing the recently-matured US Bank CD into this IntraFi Network.

Except for pool expenses, we're under budget through the end of June in other operating expenses by about \$12,401. Our operating cash less current liabilities stands at about \$18,019, a decent amount for this time of the year. The delinquency report still shows quite a few delinquent homeowners, however, Board members discussed the situation at the July 18 meeting and reviewed the procedure that the accounting firm is using to contact delinquent owners. We believe their process is adequate and will give it some more time to see if the delinquencies go down. However, there was one delinguent account that was over \$1900 despite repeated contacts, and so the Board approved filing a lien on the homeowner.



LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE REPORT

With July's heat, it was time to up the water on the lawns. I met with Jose from Waldron several times in person, on the phone and via email. We decided to add 10 minutes to everyone's irrigation. Six days a week. I have seen improvement in the lawns, greener, fuller, less burned. It will take a while, but we are improving. Wait a month to see what it looks like before commenting. You can also do what I do, I see a weed in my grass, I pull it out. If an area looks dry, I water it myself with my hose. We are putting the maximum water we can right now. Any more and we have to water during the day and night. Daytime watering evaporates faster and is not recommended.

As Steve mentioned in the July HOA meeting, our sprinkler system is very old, the pipes leak a lot of water before the water gets to your yard. Starting in January 2025, California has permanent water restrictions. Some desert communities in Southern California have to reduce water use by 30%. Northern California has to save water but not that much. There will be rules on how much water sprinkler systems can leak, so it's key to have a modern sprinkler system.

Weeds. I tested the natural weed killer, vinegar, salt and dish detergent. It does work, I had to use it three times on some weeds. I started just pouring it on the weeds instead of spraying them. Pouring works better, not sure Waldron can do this. I am going to try pouring boiling water on the weeds, my last natural weed killer option.



I am proud to say that I picked my first apple that I grew in my yard. A Gravenstein espalier tree is thriving on our fence. The apple is small,

there are more, but the first one is always the

sweetest. The Gravenstein Apple festival is August 10th to the 11th. Maybe I'll enter my apple at the fair!

BOOK CLUB NEWS


Last month we read *The Spoon Stealer* by

LOSS OF ONE OF OUR DEAR NEIGHBORS - CECILIA ANGEL

Letter to the Chantarelle Community:



After only 102 years, Mamacita has passed. She was one-of-a-kind and, at the same time, she was the neighborhood's "grandma". Or, as the family calls her "abuelita". To her family she was priceless. To her friends she was irreplaceable. For her neighborhood and her neighbors, she was grateful.

Cecilia Angel, was born in Colombia, South America and for 70 years lived in the United States - she was our "All-American". Now she has moved on to reunite with her husband Ignacio, whom she met in Bogota, Colombia. He also passed away in Sonoma.

The Angels immigrated to the U.S. in 1958 and moved to San Francisco in 1962. Ignacio was a custom tailor who taught Cecilia the art of being a seamstress. She put that skill to work at Macys for 30 years. Upon retirement

they moved to Sonoma, arriving in 1989 when the community of Chantarelle was just built. Temelec Circle became their new address. Now, she's living with Angels.

Living in Sonoma was the best of times for Cecilia. She got to know just about everyone delivering the newsletter for years. She put her skills to work by doing alterations for her neighbors until her late 90's. Walking the neighborhood became her daily ritual. The Clubhouse, where her 95th birthday party was held, became a friendly retreat. The swimming pool became her passion as she was in charge of the water aerobics crew.

Cecilia loved to travel. She would pack on a moment's notice. Mamacita was grateful she could travel with her daughter CeCe and take advantage of her Alaska Airlines privileges. Cecilia was strong-

willed. She was able to quit smoking - unfortunately, not until the age of 80. Otherwise, she might have made it to 110!

Cecilia is survived by her daughter CeCe and her two "mijito lindos" - Joe, a former S.F. Giants broadcaster and Iggy, a Giants fan and a long time Sonoma resident.
