

Gloucester County now has a total of 8 positive cases of COVID-19 and has had 97 negative tests. NJ is now up to 1,914 confirmed cases. I had the opportunity to participate in a conference call this evening with representatives from the Governor's office, the County and the Mayors of Gloucester, Cumberland and Salem counties. The purpose was to review the recent executive orders. Much of the information shared can be found in the summary of Executive Orders 107 & 108 that is posted under photos here on this page.

*Residents are reminded of the changes in trash, recycling and brush pick-up that was posted here on Friday, Saturday and today...only black totes will be collected for the week of 3/23/2020. Those directives will be reassessed by the end of the week to determine how we will move forward. *McCowan Memorial Library remains closed indefinitely as ordered by Governor Murphy this weekend.

*Our Borough employees within the Finance and Construction offices are still working as of right now only on essential services or on services described here previously, but public access to Borough Hall remains restricted. Please call 856-589-3522 if you have any questions.
