SUNDAY PACKAGE SALES ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE NO. ____

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF

OCILLA GEORGIA TO ALLOW FOR SUNDAY PACKAGE SALES OF MALT BEVERAGES, WINE AND DISTILLED SPIRITS; TO AUTHORIZE A REFERENDUM; TO PROVIDE FOR AN ADOPTION AND EFFECTIVE DATE; AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES.
WHEREAS, the City of OCILLA. Georgia is charged with providing for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City; and
WHEREAS, the City is authorized to regulate package sales of alcoholic beverages in the City and, until recently, sale of same was not authorized on Sundays; and
WHEREAS, SB 10, approved by the 2011 Legislative Session and signed by the Governor, authorizes package sales of <u>malt beverages</u> , <u>wine and distilled spirits</u> to be sold on Sundays in any local government jurisdiction that desires to place same on a referendum for a vote on a general election ballot and the referendum receives a majority approval; and
WHEREAS, that in order to place the question on a referendum, a local governing authority must pass Resolution or Ordinance permitting sales of alcohol on Sundays between the hours of 12:30 p.m. and 11:30 p.m., and forward a certified copy of same to the Elections Superintendent for placing on the ballot; and
WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend City Code to provide for Sunday sales of malt beverages, wine and distilled spirits and desires to place the question for a referendum on theNOVEMBER,2020 election ballot.
THEREFORE, THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GEORGIA, HEREBY ORDAIN as follows:
SECTION ONE
That Section (Alcoholic Beverages) of the Code of Ordinances, City of, Georgia, is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a)	No licensee shall permit the sale of alcoholic beverages on any day or during any time of day when such sales are prohibited by state law.						
(b)	No Retail Package licensee shall be permitted to sell package <u>malt beverages</u> , <u>wine and distilled spirits</u> on Sundays except between the hours of 12:30 p.m. and 11:30 p.m.						
(c)	No Restaurant licensee shall be permitted to sell <u>malt beverages</u> , <u>wine and distilled spirits</u> on Sundays except between the hours of 12:30 p.m. and 11:30 p.m.						
	Sec Hours of Operation.						
	Package licensees shall not engage in the sale of alcoholic beverages except between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 11:45 p.m. Monday through Saturday and between the hours of 12:30 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. on Sunday. Package licensees shall not permit their places of business to be open except between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 11:45 p.m. Monday through Saturday, or between the hours of 12:30 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. on Sundays, except that where the primary business of a malt beverage package licensee or wine package licensee is other than the sale of alcoholic beverages, such restrictive hours shall apply only with respect to the sale of malt beverages or wine.

	Upon adoption of this Ordinance, the same shall be forwarded to the City's Election Superintendent for inclusion on the <u>NOVEMBER</u> , <u>2020</u> election ballot as a question as follows:						
	() YES () NO Shall the governing authority of the City of <u>OCILLA</u> , Georgia, be authorized to permit and regulate package sales by retailers of <u>malt beverages</u> , wine, and distilled spirits on Sundays between the hours of 12:30 P.M. and 11:30 P.M.?						
	() YES () NO Shall the governing authority of the City of OCILLA, Georgia, be authorized to permit and regulate on premise sales by restaurants of malt beverages, wine, and distilled spirits on Sundays for beverage purposes by the drink between 12:30 P.M. to 11:45 P.M.?						
	SECTION THREE						

That the Election Superintendent is further authorized and directed to place an advertisement in the OCILLA STAR newspaper once a week for four weeks prior to the date of the NOVEMBER, 2020, Election where the above question shall be placed on the ballot, stating the date and purpose of this Referendum to be placed on the ballot in the advertisement.	
SECTION FOUR	
All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.	
SECTION FIVE	
This Ordinance shall become effective on <u>DECEMBER</u> 1, 2020 so long as the Referendum authorized by this Ordinance is approved by the majority of the voters on the <u>NOVEMBER</u> , 2020, Election Ballot. If the Referendum is not approved by a majority of the voters, this Ordinance shall be null and void.

Alternatively I did look into the .com extension for the City of Ocilla and found it is available. If you choose, you can register https://cityofocillaga.com and switch your hosting to that moving forward. This is simply an option to consider since the .com domain is more common.

Phase 1: The first phase is where AYT will re-design the look and feel of your current website. We will use your existing site as the basis for what content is needed on the new site but will update the look and feel to a more modern design.

Deliverable: At the end of Phase 1 you will receive a recommendation of all content needed and a layout for the re-designed City of Ocilla website.







Mayor Matt Seales presented the Council will his Tax Equality Resolution. He read it and explained to the Council in details what this will do for the City of Ocilla. He said he talked to Councilwoman Patrice Manley and she in favor of it.

RESOLUTION ON EQUALITY IN TAXATION FOR TAXPAYERS AND RESIDENTS OF THE CITY OF OCILLA, GEORGIA

WHEREAS the City of Ocilla, GA is located within Irwin County, GA; and,

WHEREAS some services provided to residents and property owners in the City of Ocilla are provided by Irwin County, while others are provided by the City of Ocilla; and

WHEREAS some services are provided by Irwin County for the primary benefit of residents and property owners in the unincorporated area of Irwin County; and,

WHEREAS OCGA 36-70-24 provides that "the cost of any service which a county provides primarily for the benefit of the unincorporated area of the county shall be bourne by the unincorporated area residents, individuals, and property owners who receive the service"; and

WHEREAS OCGA 36-70-24 also states that "when the county and one or more municipalities jointly fund a county-wide service, the county share of such funding shall be bourne by the unincorporated residents, individuals, and property owners that receive the service;" and

WHEREAS services provided primarily for the benefit of the unincorporated area of Irwin County include, but are not limited to: garbage service through dumpster sites, road and drainage maintenance, water service, fire service (including the building, manning, training and equipping of county fire stations), and law enforcement patrol and investigative services; and

WHEREAS services provided county-wide through joint funding include, but are not limited to: recreation programs, Joint Drug Task Force, Irwin-Ben Hill Joint Development Authority, Irwin County Senior Center operations, and Irwin County Library; and

WHEREAS the Mayor of Ocilla has attempted to address these issues since 2016 in public meetings and private conversations with Irwin County Commissioners, by pointing out the issue and recommending its resolution through lowering the property tax for incorporated taxpayers more than unincorporated taxpayers, as well as by instructing on how to implement a special service district and even providing the actual resolution to create one; and

WHEREAS the split of sales tax revenue in Irwin County is more than 60% to the Irwin County government even though over 80% of the sales tax revenue is generated by retail operations inside the incorporated limits of the City of Ocilla; and

WHEREAS not a single member of the Irwin County Commission has made any attempt through any recommendation or motion on record to correct this inequality;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Ocilla, Georgia, seeking fairness and equality for its citizens and property owners, that changes must be made and we implore the Irwin County Commission to make the necessary changes, as required by law, to address the unfair subsidy by citizens and taxpayers of the City of Ocilla to fund services that are for the primary benefit of residents and taxpayers in the unincorporated area of Irwin County and county-wide services where the cost is shared between the two governments.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the same Mayor and City Council hereby formally request that Irwin County, in accordance with OCGA 36-70-24, show documentation showing revenues received through mechanisms approved to fund services for the primary benefit of the residents and taxpayers of the unincorporated area of Irwin County along with the costs associated with those services for each fiscal year dating back to 1999.
