IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT  
YOUR DRINKING WATER

WALDENBURG COMMUNITY WATER SYSTEM has levels of Radium, Combined (226, 228) Above Drinking Water Standards

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Testing results we received on August 26, 2016 show that our system exceeds the standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for Radium, Combined (226, 228). The standard for Radium, Combined (226,228) is 5 PCI/L. The average level of Radium, Combined (226,228) over the last year was 5.6 PCI/L.

What should I do?

You do not need to use an alternative (e.g. bottled) water supply. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

What does this mean?

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have notified immediately. However, some people who drink water containing Radium 226 or 228 in excess of the MCL over man years may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

What happened? What is being done?

At this time, we monitor and wait. IF there are three MCL in 12 months, a Preliminary Engineering Plan is assigned. Combined Radium is often removed by Ion Exchange softening, or by Hydrous Manganese Oxide (HMO). Both work well for the supplies in Iowa currently using them.
