# From the Pastor's Desk

Free to Be

Are you as free as you want to be? Jesus died to set us free from all earthly and spiritual bondage, so why are we still so bound up in worry, jealousy, anxiety, depression, anger, shame, guilt, and the like? It's because we haven't fully embraced the freedom that Jesus died to give us.

What's keeping us from being free? Strongholds. What is a stronghold? A stronghold is a pattern of thinking or system of logic that is rooted in a lie. This system of thinking is formed around any habitual response, addiction, fixation, compulsion, obsession and inordinate fear. Strongholds are a primary strategy of Satan's work around the world and in our lives. Strongholds distort our perceptions of everything we encounter. And everyone has them.

What do strongholds do in our lives? They prevent or retard our emotional and spiritual growth and maturity. They cause conflict, separation, and divorce in marriage. They cause division in churches. They provoke bitterness, jealousy, anxiety, and depression. They keep people from accepting what Christ has made them to be and thus keeps them from fulfilling their personal destiny in God. Strongholds are a foothold or a place of operation that the devil uses to enslave us. Strongholds produce financial disorder and will bring spiritual disorientation. Strongholds weaken our body and make us vulnerable to diseases. Strongholds provoke us to respond to others in ways that even we do not understand. They fragment attempted friendships and steal our joy and hope. Strongholds stifle our faith and distort Scripture. They cloud and darken our minds and imprison our spirits. Strongholds allow us to give only a begrudging love, at best. They keep us from forgiving others.

#### Advent - The Season of Giving

It is a long-standing tradition here at Belleview UMC that during the liturgical seasons of Advent and Lent, a special offering is made for causes that promote the ongoing mission of Jesus Christ in our world.

Jesus said, "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19) and "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1: 8) we strive to fulfill this ongoing mission. Our "Jerusalem" is our community, Belleview; our "Judea" is our country, which includes missions within the United States; our "Samaria" is anywhere we don't want to go or might want to avoid; the ends of the earth obviously refer to other nations in our world.

Since the church budget as well as United Methodist Women and Methodist Men United sponsor local mission efforts in Belleview ("Jerusalem"), this year's advent offering will be divided between BUMC's Red Bird Mission trip ("Judea") and the sponsorship of an international missionary in Zambia. ("the ends of the earth")

A group from BUMC will be going to the Red Bird Mission in Beverly, Kentucky, April 22 through April 29, 2017. In 1919, a group of church women in Illinois began praying that a mission work begin in the Southern Highlands of the Appalachian region. They established a faith fund. In 1921, a Christian school was opened. In 1922, a medical clinic was opened. The mission has continued to grow since then, adding more ministries, including the work camp. The work camp volunteers bring hope to low-income families through home repair. The \$375.00 per person registration fee is used solely to purchase material for the project. The entire Red Bird Mission is funded by donations, with the exception of some grants that the K-12 school receives.

While it is true that poverty exists everywhere in our country, the level of poverty and lack of resources in the Appalachian region is astounding. The average person in the US living in poverty has electricity, running water, a cell phone, and access to health care. Thousands of people in the area around Red Bird live with no running water, 1 light bulb running from another trailer, and no access to medical care. There are no cellular towers in the area where we go.

Delbert and Sandy Groves are United Methodist missionaries based in Kitwe, Zambia. Delbert was ordained as an elder by the Zambia Provisional Conference in 2006. He is a member of the Florida Annual Conference. Delbert's focus is on church leadership and spiritual growth training. Sandy serves at the New Life Center, which was established in 2001 through their efforts. It has numerous outreach ministries, including health education, handicap bikes for mobility, a learning and computer lab. Delbert and Sandy will visit BUMC Sunday, January 8.

Our goal is to raise a total of \$5,000 to support these two missions. Thank you for praying and being a part of God's plan for His people.

Have you met Evelyn Day? She recently joined BUMC. Evelyn, welcome to our family.

Evelyn was born in Steubenville, Ohio (go Buckeyes!). She has lived in south Georgia (go Dogs!). She has lived in Florida (go Gators!) since 1973. She has been employed with K-Mart since 1973 and is currently the manager of the Belleview store.

While she lived in Perry, Florida, she served First UMC in a variety of capacities, including staff parish and as emergency coordinator. She was involved in a number of community activities including Boys & Girls Club and Rotary.

She has always been a Methodist and has served in many positions - youth leader, Youth for Christ, Women's Guild. At BUMC, she is a member of the Vision team and volunteering at the Food Pantry.

Evelyn enjoys traveling. She is looking forward to meeting new friends. We are happy to have her as a new member of our congregation.
