



The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children

Here at our parish, we are transitioning away from Children's Liturgy of the Word during the Mass, and instead, we would like to encourage parents to discuss the weekly readings or homily with their children either before or after Mass occurs. This spiritual conversation, even if it is simple or a bit scattered, can be very powerful, and it is a way for God's word to come alive in our hearts. We will provide questions and discussion points to help parents start this conversation with their children, and please consider doing this with your family each week!

In today's Gospel Jesus meets Zacchaeus, a very short man, who wanted to see Jesus. Zacchaeus was a tax collector. In Genesis, Joseph, the son of Jacob and Rachel, asked the people to give one fifth of their grain so it could be saved for a time when the crops didn't grow. It was a way for everyone to help in a time of need. Sometimes people couldn't see where this would help and didn't like paying the tax. Remember tax collectors weren't liked because they kept some of the tax for themselves. The people considered tax collectors sinnners. Because Zacchaeus was the chief collector, he was considered a great sinner.

When Jesus was passing through Jericho, Zacchaeus found a way to be able to see Jesus. **What did Zacchaeus do?**

Jesus noticed Zacchaeus and said he wanted to eat a meal with Zacchaeus in his house.

Why would Jesus want to spend time with someone people thought was a sinner? We find the answer in the first reading: "For you love all things that are..."

God made Zacchaeus and he loved him very much.

Zacchaeus was inspired to change for the better. He would pay back everyone he had unjustly taken money from, and even more, he would pay back four times what he had taken.

We too are loved by God because he made us. We may become lost by sinning, by God always calls us back to him. Jesus calls us to share a meal with him, just like he did with Zacchaeus, This meal is the Eucharist, or the Mass, that we celebrate each week.



Living our Faith: Celebrate the Mass by praying the prayers, singing the songs and listening to God as he

talks to us in the readings.
