

Fact sheet: CCS and metastatic breast cancer

The Canadian Cancer Society (CCS) understands that people living with metastatic breast cancer face a range of physical, practical and emotional challenges that can greatly affect their quality of life.

CCS is committed to offering programs and services to help support those living with metastatic breast cancer, as well as their loved ones.

We are also committed to funding the country's most innovative and promising research on metastatic breast cancer.

Our research

In 2017, CCS invested \$5.1 million of its total \$16.4 million breast cancer research investment in projects focused on metastatic breast cancer. This represents 31% of our total breast cancer research investment in 2017.

In the last 10 years, CCS and the former Canadian Breast Cancer Foundation have together invested more than \$51 million in metastatic breast cancer research, representing more than 22% of our total breast cancer research investment.

Current research topics include investigating:

- microscopic metastases with a simple blood test to better target treatments
- the effect of diet and exercise in chemotherapy response in patients with metastatic breast cancer
- how breast cancer develops and spreads to different organs, and new ways to stop it
- new ways to deliver drugs to metastatic breast tumours to maximize their effectiveness and limit side effects.

CCS is partnering with the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) and SU2C Canada to fund the **SU2C Canada Metastatic Breast Cancer Dream Team**. The Dream Team will receive up to \$6 million in support over 4 years. It will bring together the most talented and promising researchers from across Canada to implement advances in metastatic breast cancer research as quickly as possible. Drawing on expertise from multiple disciplines and using the most advanced molecular tools, the Dream Team will work together to answer some of the most challenging questions in metastatic breast cancer research. CCS, SU2C Canada and CIHR believe that this unique Dream Team model will advance scientific research in the interests of both today's cancer patients and those who may develop cancer in the future. The selection process is ongoing and we hope to announce the winning Dream Team in early 2019.
