Pearl M. Kain, 97, formerly of Gagetown and Pigeon, passed away Saturday, April 28, 2007, at Huron Medical Care Facility near Bad Axe after a brief illness. She was born May 4, 1909 in Columbia Township near Unionville, daughter of the late John and Melvina (Bedore) Comment. On April 25, 1931 she was united in marriage to Leslie (Ted) Kain at St. Agatha Catholic Church in Gagetown. He preceded her in death on December 31, 1991 after over 60 years of marriage.
