

SWIM CORNER

Adult Fitness Swim

Hiddenbrook will once again host an adult fitness swim program this summer, starting on Monday June 22nd. We'll be meeting Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 7:00am, finishing at 8:00am. The swims will continue through July and August, with the last swim on Friday September 4th. The program will be led by Neal Jarvis, the head coach of the Hiddenbrook Hurricanes swim team. We will have all 8 lanes available, so we'll be able to accommodate swimmers of all abilities. The day will start with putting the lane lines in the water, followed by a short warm-up, and then swimming a set provided by Neal.

Hiddenbrook Waterspouts Program

Back in 2004, the idea for a developmental squad was born out of the simple desire to improve our Hiddenbrook Hurricanes Swim Team. Every year there were a few kids that wanted to be on the team, but would be excluded because they didn't meet the minimum requirement: swim one length of the pool. We figured that if we could help those kids develop into swimmers at an early age, they'd be more likely to stick with it and join the team the following year.

We came up with a name, and our own little made up definition:

wa ter spout (wô'tər-spout') n, a small waterborne tornado, often associated with hurricanes.

The first 2 years went ok, with about 5 - 6 kids, and a pair of high school kids working with them. Our team at that time averaged fewer than 90 kids, ages 6 - 18. By 2007, the Waterspouts had grown to almost 20 kids. Lisa Fagan took over heading up the program, and we were starting to get lots of good feedback and word of mouth. The next year, we were presented with another problem that helped to shape some of our concepts of what we were doing. We had too many teenagers apply to be "junior coaches", the ones that work in the water with the Waterspouts. We decided to keep them all. Like many summer teams, our older kids tend to fade away and dwindle in number in their high school years. We saw this as a chance to motivate the older kids to stay as active participants on the team. We would pay them to coach the Waterspouts, but in turn they were also expected to attend their own practice and provide leadership to the whole team. One of my favorite things about the whole program is to see the connection develop between our youngest kids and our oldest kids. This year we'll have at least 10 coaches involved with the Waterspouts, and, besides the money, I think they get as much out of the program as the little kids.

We steadily increased our numbers each year, and we now typically have 50-60 Waterspouts on the team. Many of our best swimmers on the team started out as Waterspouts; in fact, team records have been set by swimmers whose first experience with the team was as a Waterspout. The number of kids sticking with the team has increased as well - we're up to 125 swimmers on the team. We consider our Waterspouts as regular members of the team, and include them in all our social events. After the last practice in July, we have a fun "lollipop" meet (races with coach assistance), followed by an awards party. The meet and party are run by the coaches and the older kids on the team, and it's fun to watch how hard they cheer for the little kids. I think that what makes our Waterspout program so popular is not just that the parents see improvements in their kid's swimming, but that the kids have fun. We want them to develop a love for the sport, and having fun is an important factor in that.

I'm a strong believer in getting kids swimming at an early age. They may not develop into Olympic level competitors, but they will be far better swimmers than if they hadn't been pushed for the 6 weeks that they're part of our team.
