# VI. THE CITY COUNCIL MAY DISCUSS AND/OR TAKE ACTION ON ANY OF THE FOLLOWING AGENDA ITEMS:

#### A. Consider and Discuss Extending Lake Lot Leases Beyond 2040.—William Wright, Jr.

Mr. Archer explained that with the current leases set to expire in 2040, lenders are wary to grant loans for lake lot lease properties being that the lease would expire prior to the amortization of the loan. Mr. Wright further stated that the lease expiration is a problem, but he also thinks the leases themselves are outdated and certain other provisions need to be updated as well. Mr. Archer stated that his recommendation was as the leases change hands, that the new lease be set with a new expiration date of 2070. The Council further discussed the price point of the leases and the maintenance of the roads leading to the leasehold properties.

Motion was made by Councilmember R. Johnson to extend any leases expiring or changing hands to an expiration date of 2070, second was made by Councilmember W. Forester. Motion prevailed by the following vote:

Mr. Wright said that he would draw up a new lease showing the other updated provisions and bring it to Council for approval at a later meeting.

# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS, APPROVING WAIVER OF PAYMENTS IN LIEU OF TAXES FOR THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF CISCO PUBLIC HOUSING DEVELOPMENTS.

Mr. Archer explained that the proposed resolution was a formal document to back up action taken previously by the Council to permanently waive PILOT payments from the Cisco Housing Authority.

# D. Consider and Discuss Granting a Variance to the Open Container Ordinance for Activities Associated with the Folklife Festival.

Mayor Douglas stated that the Civic League is requesting the standard variance granted previously from Friday, April 24, 2020, at 5:00 p.m. through Sunday, April 26, 2020, at midnight. Councilmember Forester asked if the variance was really necessary for the events planned to which Mayor Douglas answered that the event organizers just wanted people to have the option to visit the brewery and potential new wineries and then leave to wander the rest of the festival. He expressed that he was not in favor of the variance. Mr. Archer commented that historically, the Police Department has not had any problems thus far with the granting of the variance. Chief Preston agreed that any problems that might arise would be handled.

Motion was made by Councilmember R. Johnson to grant the variance as requested, second was made by Councilmember Boles. Motion prevailed by the following vote:

#### E. Consider and Discuss Closure of Streets for Activities Associated with the Folklife Festival.

Mr. Archer provided the Council with a map depicting the proposed street closures. The requested streets would be closed from 6:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 25, 2020 through 7:00 p.m. the same day. The streets closed will be Joe Wheatley Circle and the 100 Block of W. 3<sup>rd</sup> St.

#### F. Consider and Discuss Long Range Planning.

Mr. Archer stated that city offices will be closed February 17, 2020 for President's Day; the last day to file for a place on the May Election ballot is February 14, 2020; April 18, 2020, will be city-wide clean up with a provided tire disposal trailer; April 20-24 will be the clean sweep event for Code Enforcement; and then Folklife Festival will be April 25, 2020. Further, he is still waiting on a contract from TCEQ to begin the risk assessment on the dam.

#### G. Announcements from City Council.

Councilmember Escobedo praised the revival of the school crossing on 8<sup>th</sup> Street.
