ave you ever been to the Circus World Museum in Baraboo? It is a museum devoted to circus-related history. Back in 1884, five of the seven Ringling brothers started a small circus in Baraboo, Wis., and eventually purchased the Barnum and Bailey Greatest Show on Earth in 1907. I have been told that years ago when the circus came to Wausau, it would be settled on the very land that the district office now stands, and remain there before moving on.

When the circus came to town in the early 1900s, there were no media outlets that we have now. There was no TV, and the radio age didn't begin until the 1920s. So when the circus came to town, I was told that they would take the circus wagons and animals through town to advertise that they were present, letting people know when the three-ring circus would take place.

So the animals would parade through town and on occasion — as animals do — leave a fertilized trail. To keep things clean there were the circus personnel who would follow with their form of pooper-scoopers to clean up after the animals. Even today we hope those who walk their dogs are considerate enough to clean up after their dog.

Recently a fellow district president shared a devotion mentioning the circus parade and cleanup after the animals. The verse that he shared that fit was Psalm 23:6:

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD forever

"Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life." If we focus on those words, we through faith are comforted that on a daily basis our Good Shepherd is watching out and caring for us.

"We daily sin much and surely deserve nothing but punishment" is what Martin Luther wrote in explaining the Fifth Petition of the Lord's Prayer, but we know that punishment is what our Lord endured for us. Jesus died on the cross and suffered what we should have suffered. Basically, we made a mess of things with our sinful lives, and then Jesus has followed us and cleaned up our mess through His death.

We can sing with the children, "Jesus loves me this I know." As believers we




We collect used eyeglasses for MOST Ministries and canceled stamps for mission funds.




High school students: Learn about life at CSL

Lutheran School Accreditation

wenty of our 21 North Wisconsin District elementary/high schools have achieved National Lutheran School Accreditation (NLSA), along with one early childhood center. This April seven of those schools will renew their accreditation.

The rigorous process includes surveys, completing an extensive self-study based on seven best-practice standards. providing evidence that shows achievement of the multiple indicators under each standard, and creation of a fiveyear school action plan to prepare for ongoing improvement. All of the work is reviewed by the district's NLSA consultant, reviewed in detail by an onsite validation team, reviewed and recommended by the district Accreditation Commission, and finally approved and accepted by the LCMS National Accreditation Commission.

Congratulations to all of our accredited schools and thank you to those serving on validation teams.
