HAWAII

Following its annexation to the U.S., Hawaii's federal judicial system consisted of a district court with a single judge.¹ Statehood established it as a constitutional court with two judgeships.² Hawaii is housed in the Ninth Circuit and has four judgeships, three permanent and one temporary.³
