#### BE ATTENTIVE TO JESUS EVEN WHEN WE ARE BUSY



The prophet Isaiah proclaims, and Matthew repeats, that the virgin's son shall be named Emmanuel, meaning "God is with us" (Matthew 1:23). But the angel of the Lord tells both Mary and Joseph that her Son is to be named Jesus, "because He will save His people from their sins" (1:21). The son of God is both: God incarnated in our world, truly divine and truly human, and our Savior, born into this world so that He might die for our sins and bridge our fundamental separation

from God. Wrapped up in the Incarnation is the seed of the Resurrection. God with us is God saving us. Emmanuel is Jesus.

Joseph, Matthew writes, did not want to expose his betrothed to shame, and her unexpected pregnancy would lead to whispers or worse. Remember Adam and Eve's first reaction once their eyes were opened? They felt shame. They sewed fig leaves to make loin clothes for themselves and they hid from the Lord. Disobedience led to shame, which led to separation from God. But God was not willing to leave us orphaned in shame. The Son was born into this world as an act of divine mercy, to save us from our disobedience to God, We, the Church, are the Bride of Christ, betrothed to Jesus, who like Joseph, does not want us to be left in shame.

Joseph was a righteous man, Matthew tells us, devoutly observing the law. He was also a decisive man, working out a plan that would enable him to uphold the law in a way that would be merciful to his betrothed. But the angel of the Lord intervened and Joseph immediately changed his plans. He remained as decisive as before, but with a brand new decision. We may not experience anything as dramatic as Josephs' dream, but God can intervene in our lives as well, asking us to change our plans, no matter how decisive we already are. May we remain open to God's intervention in our lives.

#### **QUESTION OF THE DAY:**

Through all the excitement and stress of this coming week, can I be attentive to how Jesus remains with me and discern how God is calling me?



## EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS St. Joseph the Steward

St. Joseph is one of the greatest examples of stewardship we have in the Gospels. Here is a man who understands care and reverence for the property of God, a man chosen to be steward over the very life and breath of God's Son and Spouse.

Joseph was mindful. He recognized what belonged to God. When he understood that Mary was to be the mother of God, he was not jealous or bitter. He did not presume to claim ownership over her.

Joseph was prayerful. He accepted the opportunity to be in relationship with God, even if it was in a radical and unexpected way. How many of us would trust a crazy dream we have where an angel tells us our fiancée is carrying the Son of God? Well, those of us who are already profoundly connected to God through prayer. Joseph was open to receiving God, and so he was open to the truth in a way many of us would not have been.

Joseph was gracious. Even before he had full understanding of the situation, he was unwilling to expose Mary to shame. He did not give himself over to feelings of betrayal.

Joseph was committed. He persevered. The Lord had no shortage of strange and even dangerous-sounding tasks for Joseph, but he submitted to each one.

Joseph was accountable. When he awoke from his dream, "he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him, and took his wife into his home."

Joseph was a man entrusted with many gifts, and he gave of them wisely. Let us pray that we have the grace to follow in his example.
