In addition, New Haven Baptist from just south of us in Tennessee continues to bring their youth up to help whenever we are running short handed.

Another huge answer to prayer, we have finalized the purchase of The Lord's Café property! Thank you to all who helped to make this possible. Our monthly payment has also been reduced by \$250 per month. We are thankful!

The Learning Center

Why Plant A Church?

From the church planting class of 2010 (the year Crossroads was started)

- Survival Rate—943 SBC churches planted—91% still in operation
- Membership—2010 church plants saw a membership gain of 20% in 2012 over 2011; overall membership in SBC churches declined .66%
- Attendance—At the same time, worship attendance grew 11% with church plants; average attendance of SBC churches fell 3%
- Baptisms—Planting churches reported 3,394 baptisms. Among all SBC churches there is a ratio of one baptism for every 50 members. For church plants, the ratio is one baptism for ever 12 members.
- Crossroads has baptized over 30 new believers over the past three and half years.
- The Lord's Café has fed over 29,000 lunches in three years.
- After School @ The Learning Center completed 5 semesters of tutoring. Many of the students have seen significant improvements in grade, and more importantly, knowledge and wisdom of God.

Our desire is to continue planting more churches for HIS glory!
