1. **UDO AMENDMENT BRIEFING**

WA UDO-22

Doc: This text amendment is proposed by All In Self Storage to amend the definition of Built-Upon Area and Impervious Cover in Chapter C of the UDO to allow gravel surfaces to be considered as pervious rather than impervious.

The state allows gravel as pervious surface.

We might offer SIDA of .057 acres instead of changing the UDO.

Peggy: With a retention pond they could build on 30%, up from 24%. The purpose of having pervious surfaces is to protect watershed quality.

Scott: The Planning Board motion for approval did not pass by 2 to 2 vote.

The council will hear this in December.

Council agrees to have Bo check on limiting built upon area to less than 70%.

WA UDO-23

Doc: This text amendment is proposed by the Town of Walkertown amending Chapters A & B of the UDO to amend the regulations relating to Manufactured Homes.

We are proposing to limit new Class A(doublewides) Manufactured Homes to properties zoned RS30 & RS40 with brick underpinning, and a 5/12 pitched roof.

How to handle "grandfathered in" trailers is up to you.

Scott: Class B & C units would only be allowed in MH districts.

The Planning Board unanimously approved.

2. PLANNING BOARD UPDATE

Scott: We have a vacancy that needs to be filled by council. Chuck's term ends this year, so we need to see if he plans to continue on the board. First consideration would go to one of the current alternates, Jerry Pegram or Steve Fowler.

We have 2 new applications for you to consider as alternates.

We can have up to 3 alternates.

Scott: We have 2 estimates for replacing the 2.5 ton gaspack and with new duct system.
