41st Annual Christmas Bird Count

Saturday, December 28, a small group of volunteers fanned out across Amana meadows, forests and river bottom as part of a national effort to count birds promoted by the Audubon Society. Volunteers across American made similar forays to count birds.

Lanny Haldy, who organizes this effort, noted that this was Amana's 41st annual count. The weather was excellent, but rain the day before made roads and pathways muddy restricting access in some areas. However, temps in the 40s and sunny weather meant the volunteers were happy to walk and to be out as long as possible. The warm temperature also meant that the Lily Lake and Iowa River were open and full of waterfowl.

Haldy notes that 43 different species of birds were sighted, including one rare sighting of a Yellow-bellied Sapsucker. Forty-three is exactly the annual count's average. The most species ever seen here during a Christmas count was 50, Haldy said.

The Lily Lake had over 2,000 Canada Geese, but the biggest surprise was the high number of Trumpeter swans. Over 700 Trumpeter swans were counted on the lake, in river bottom fields and in a field just west of West Amana which had a large congregation.

"That 700 was twice that of any previous count and pretty amazing considering that 20 years ago the number was ZERO. One of our participants commented that Amana must be welcoming all the swans in the world," Haldy concluded.

The number of song birds sighted was down a bit this year, perhaps because the warm weather meant they were scattered about.
