A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ROBERT.....

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

I have been watching Ken Burn's Civil War documentary series on the Civil War and while slavery, states rights, racism, and power were all involved in the reasons why war broke out I believe they were all secondary to the real reason behind it all, fear. In the north they feared that succession was a threat to the government's power, and in the south they feared change that freeing the slaves would bring to their economy. This fear would manifest its self in anger, frustration, hate, and bitterness resulting in the deaths of nearly 650,000 people between the years 1861-1865. Since then there have been several more movements that have brought fundamental change to our society including the Industrial Revolution, Civil Rights movement, and currently, the Black Lives Matter and Me Too movements are changing the way we think and act as I write this. Every movement throughout history has affected the world in both positive and negative ways pushing us forward in often unexpected directions. Black Lives Matter and Me Too continue to grow and affect our society in various ways, what the end results of those movements are we have yet to know, but things are changing, and that can be scary.

The church in general is changing as well as its place in society is shifting. Once upon a time Churches were the center of our communities yet due to a variety of rea-

sons we have seen local churches sidelined. Some of these reasons are beyond the control of local churches as the culture around them continues to change. Unfortunately, some of the reasons why this is happening is the fault of the churches themselves as they may have abused their power, were not welcoming to newcomers, or failed to progress in order to meet the needs of the communities around them. One of the main reasons is that we live in an increasingly more diverse population where people's beliefs are more and more varied as a result. This can cause a lot of fear and anxiety amongst those who are living through these changes as they watch their once familiar neighborhoods change.

We must always remember that God is with us in the midst of the change. Even though there may be some rather large bumps in the road God's presence is all around us. While there are many people out there spreading anger and division regarding the changes in our society, many more are out there calling for peace and reconciliation. In many of our churches the numbers may be shrinking but the level of faith is rising. Since it is no longer socially dictated that individuals should go to church, those who do go are there of their own choosing and therefore share a much deeper faith in Christ's word than people did twenty years ago. There are many things in this world to be afraid of but remember God is in the midst of the change, all we have to do is listen to where God is leading us.

joined forces to help provide meals for those struggling with hunger in our community. They asked for help.




They didn't want money — all we had to do was wear orange and take a picture.

There will be one check-out and anyone paying by check will make it payable to Burke Lutheran Church. You will not be handling money at your display. Crafters will need to come back at 4:00pm to take down their displays. We will have your money and tags ready for you to pick up at the church office on Monday, November 12th from 2pm-3pm Please contact the church office at 244-8486, if this time doesn't works for you.

Bakers: We are in need of your delicious home-made bakery goods. 100% of the money raised from the baked goods will go to the BLCW's kitchen building fund.

The church will be open on Friday evening from 4pm-7pm for you to drop off your baked goods, or you can stop by early Saturday morning. We ask that you do not price them as we will do it to keep like items priced the same.
