This Wednesday, we will begin
another Season of Lent. The Service of
Ashes begins at 6:00 PM. Sunday is
the First Sunday of Lent. The theme
for this year is "Living into Lent."

Most often, we consider this season as
a somber time. Reflection, self-
examination and repentance are
encouraged. This year, however, we
will change the approach somewhat.
Although the above stated experiences
may be a part of your own, Lent is a
mirror image of life. Both include the
good and bad, light and darkness.

Let us look at our time together
through the lens of resurrection. I
know, we are not supposed to get to
that time until after we have passed
through several weeks until we reach
Holy Week, But where we are in the
unfolding of all this story, resurrection
will always be a point of awareness.
And for whatever else it meant,
resurrection resulted in transformation.
Lives were changed, sometimes
dramatically. At other times the
change may have evolved slowly. But
it came nonetheless. Those early
disciples caught on to what Jesus had
been saying and they lived into it.
That made all the difference!!

Lent/Life will hold that which is
enjoyable and endearing. It will hold
that which is tough and miserable. It
will drag us down. It will provide
opportunity for us to soar. Let us live
into whatever is and whatever
happens. We begin the journey of
Lent.
