

Stewarding Life in the Community of Faith with Pastor Eric

Through the testing of this ministry, you glorify God by your obedience to the confession of the gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your sharing with them and with all others, ¹⁴while they long for you and pray for you because of the surpassing grace of God that he has given you. 2 Corinthians 9:13-14

We have been hearing much about stewarding the Good News this October. My hope is that thinking about what it means to be caretakers of our blessings earlier in the fall might help us consider our piece in God's faith community pie.

Coming out of a pandemic leaves our society a bit unbalanced when it comes to our use of time and resources. We see supply shortages and higher prices for gas, car parts and food prices. We are all recovering at a different rate when it comes to "normal" behaviors. Now more than ever, our community needs to fall into God's gracious hands and start seeking ways to be patient with each other and be willing to take risks together for the good of all.

I remember asking a seminary professor once the difference between the church institution and a business. The professor shared with me something that has stuck with me over these many years. He asked me, "What does the church sell when all that it stewards is free?" When it comes to resources, our community operates on gifts and the response to God's grace at work in and through the blessings of our very life. We have budgets with no real basis for funding. You might say that all budgets are faith-based and tell us more about our priorities then what we will have to utilize each year.

People give in many ways, for many reasons and at any given time. Some gifts come regularly in the offering plate, some come in on e-tithe, while other's come at the end of the year. Gifts come as memorials, or special donations at weddings or funerals. People tend to give gifts in response to needs, or events, or ministries close to their hearts. People tithe from pay checks or from milestone events. Some gifts are legacy gifts from wills, or trusts. Many times, people give out of duty to the church, or because they love the pastor, or they owe God a special thank you. Gifts can be related to presence – family contributions at baptism, or weddings. Some families give more than others, and some do not give a single dime. Gifts can come from fundraisers, or to get significant tax breaks.

The psalmist states that God has cattle on a hundred hills and provides for his people in times of need. Ultimately the church community provides opportunities for people to share in the Good News and be a part of something beyond business as usual. We have so many gifts to share with one another to thank God and give glory to Christ Jesus — we have money, time, possessions, talents, courage, power, love — so many gifts — family, friends, jobs, nice houses, more than one car, food to choose from — so much to help those with so little at any given moment, and the sobering truth that "little" could be you and me in some way.

As we begin to consider the holiday season and wonder about our present and future, may God open our hearts to the true gifts and bounty in our homes and lives. May we pray for Kingdom values of grace, love, and gratitude as we pay the bills, pass the plates, log onto the website and hash out the budget.

Blessed to be a Blessing in Jesus's Name. Amen.


