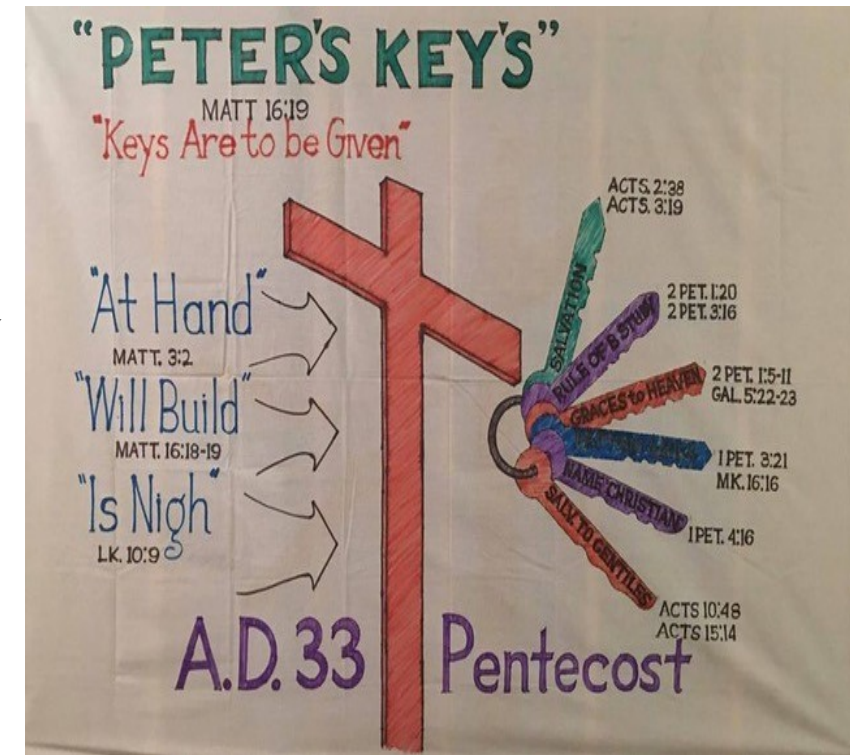

Thoughts From Hatton

Purpose of Miracles

With most of the miraculous instances previously considered, there is a specific detail that must not be ignored. The statement made is often the reason why the miracle's performance is needed. Beginning with Moses' account with the elders of Israel, the purpose revealed is "that they may believe that the Lord God of their fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob hath appeared unto thee" (Exo. 4:5). With the making of Moses' flesh leprous and clean once again, the purpose was "if they will not believe thee, neither harken to the voice of the first sign, that they will believe the voice of the latter sign" (Exo. 4:8).

Now, what must be considered is the purpose of why Elijah went after the prophets of Baal. The purpose is clearly stated at 1 Kings 18:24, which states, "And call ye on the name of your gods, and I will call on the name of the LORD: and the God that answered by fire, let him be God. And all the people answered and said, It is well spoken." As one may readily figure out, fire coming down from heaven is not a regular occurrence now, nor was it then. This was indeed a miracle. In addition to this miracle, the one at 2 Kings 5:1ff desires an explanation. The purpose was "now I know there is no God in all the earth, but in Israel: now therefore, I pray thee, take a blessing of thy servant" (2 Kings 5:15). Now, the first part of the statement would not be considered correct by modern standards, for God is everywhere.

Now, let us shift to the New Testament miracles. At the paralytic's healing "they were all amazed, and glorified God, saying, We never saw it on this fashion" (Mark 2:12). This miracle was employed for the glorification of God. The Christian life in its entirety is based upon that fact (Mat. 5:16; 2 Pet. 3:18). John 2:11 says "This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee, and manifested forth his glory; and his disciples believed on him." After this miracle was performed, it instilled belief.

The entirety of the apostles' work entailed miraculous works. The purpose of the miraculous endowments given to the apostles was simply for "confirming the word" (Mark 16:20). As John drew toward the end of his account, he revealed "and many other signs truly did Jesus in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book: But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name" (John 20:30-31). Miracles of the Bible were never used to put on a show as modern faith healers would profess. Miracles were used to confirm the legitimacy of the message and the messenger!

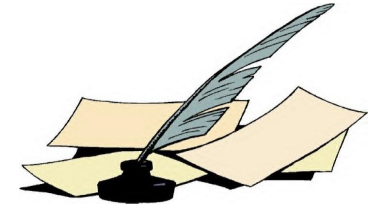
