

TITLE OF ABSTRACT (The title should accurately reflect the questions addressed by the study or project.)

The scientific abstract should contain the same information as a full paper, although on a limited and condensed scale. The completed abstract should have a title, and introduction, methods, results and conclusion sections. The length of the abstract must be no more than 250 words and must conform to the established margins (1 inch margins on the top, left, right, and bottom). All sections should be written in Arial, 11 point font. Section headers should appear in bold, and the text which follows in each section should be unbolded.

Objective: This section includes background information to introduce the current study or project, its importance to the literature, and its impact on society. The introduction should also clearly state the scientific question being investigated.

Methods: Methods used in the study should be briefly explained in this section. For example, patients studied, methods applied, and the type of study performed. When relevant, information regarding statistical comparisons should be provided. This section should demonstrate how the methods used by the authors will address the questions presented in the introduction section.

Results: This section includes a summary of any significant positive and negative results, and should be presented concisely.

Conclusions: Conclusions include the implications and significance of the data presented and recommendations for advancing the literature.
