DOG TAGS



Residents are reminded that all dogs 6 months and older are to be registered with the City every year by April 1st. Price for the tags are \$10.00 per dog. After April 1st, the price increases to \$15.00 per dog.

Per Ordinance #583, if you do not get a tag for your dog(s) it could result in a fine of not more than \$1,000!

Council Meeting Summary

Items Passed:

VonFeldt, Bauer and VonFeldt agreement for services regarding the 2022 City budget and auditing services.

Krohn got the approval to dispose of surplus properly of 3 generators, truck bed and air compressor with Purple Wave.

Spring City Wide Clean Up, staff instructed chose a date and allow \$2,000 to be used.

Approved to amend City Ordinance to change the water billing to allow for government agencies and schools to not be charged a late fee unless a payment isn't received before the next billing cycle.

Job description for Pool Manager and to begin advertising for the position.

Items Discussed:

Council decided to keep 4th Street stop signs as is due to safety of the kids who use that route to go to the City Pool.

Council Purvis asked Krohn to get estimates on street coating for Amer, 3rd, Redbud and Skene Streets.

Council will be reviewing the Community Center Rental agreement next meeting.

The City will be using the Sheriff's Office to serve Notice to Appear paperwork to residents from here on out.
